MINUTES OF MONTHLY COUNCIL MEETING
JUNE 8, 2010 at 8:00 P.M.
BARRINGTON SENIOR CENTER

A regular monthly Council Meeting of the Borough of Barrington was held on June 8, 2010, at 8:00 p.m. in the Barrington Senior Center with Mayor John D. Rink presiding.

CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Rink called the meeting to order and made the following statement: "This meeting is held in compliance with Chapter 231 of the open public meetings act of 1975 and appropriate notice has been given. PUBLIC PORTION: On a motion by KLAUS and BERGERON the public portion of the meeting was opened. Mayor Rink advised that if you have a comment or question to come forward and state your name and address for the record; each has 5 minutes to speak.

DOUG CATTS, 215 Edwards Ave, asked about the ordinance for property maintenance. Mayor Rink and Mike Ciocco, Supt. of Public Works, explained that the property maintenance ordinance is complaint driven; we don't drive around looking for offenders. After contact by letter, seven days is given to cut lawn and clean up property or DPW does the work and a lien is put on the property. If you call in we will follow up to see property is cared for and cleaned up.

With no further comments or questions from the public on a Motion by KLAUS and POPIOLEK the public portion of the meeting was closed.

COMMENTS FROM MEMBERS OF THE GOVERNING BODY:

COUNCIL PRESIDENT KLAUS – advised that the ABLE Group food giveaway is the weekends of June 12 & 26, by appointment only and the person must call on their own, someone may not call for them. We will meet at 6:30 pm on Friday June 13 to put the bags of food together; if anyone is interested in joining us please come out and give us a hand. If you know of anyone from town needing temporary help please have them call me or Eileen in the Mayor's Office 547-8585, Eileen has been diligent in organizing and setting appointments. Barrington Day was nice; a great job by all, thanks to everyone who organized the event. Have a great summer.

COUNCILMAN DINELLA – some good news, the Borough's Standard & Poors rating for bond rates went from A to A+. We are on good financial ground; the audit has had no findings for 2 years in a row. This is a direct reflection of our team in place. July 4 fireworks are behind Woodland School on July 2 at dusk, thanks to 1st Colonial Bank who donated money so the fireworks could be held. Mayor Rink added that thanks was do to borough CFO, Denise Moules; Tax Collector/Treasurer, Kristy Emmett and Municipal Clerk, Terry Shannon, along with all department heads. Without their efforts, especially Denise Moules, our audit would have turned out differently and we thank all for their efforts.

COUNCILMAN VINCENT – Pastor Jack Slotterback of Ascension Lutheran retired and his retirement dinner was very nice; we all wish him luck. The VFW is having financial problems; please support them in any way you can.

COUNCILMAN POPIOLEK – welcomed all. Advised White Horse Pike redevelopment is continuing; toured site with developer and Iron Hill; hope to have signed agreement with developer and Iron Hill soon. School is out soon so remember all roads in town have a speed limit of 25 mph so please abide the limit.

COUNCILWOMAN BERGERON – Summer Recreation program from July 5 to July 30; self sufficient, no taxes will be used to pay for this program; \$100 for first child, \$75 for second, \$50 for third and \$25 for each additional child per family. Dawn Stoltz and Nicole Lukaitis will run the program and have many events planned. 1st Colonial Bank has been very generous to us and we can continue the tradition of a parade and fireworks because of them. All will be held July 2 with parade assembly at 6 pm and start of parade at 6:30 pm; old parade route will be followed (up Clements Bridge Rd from railroad tracks, to Gloucester Pike, right at island to 5th around to Reading and out to 3rd then to Woodland School). Grand Marshall will be Uncle Mike DePierre; all clubs who had a coin toss are required to be in the parade so we should have participation from lots of clubs this year. Barrington Band will provide music prior to the fireworks behind Woodland School.

COUNCILMAN DELVECCHIO – thanks Police, Fire and EMS chiefs for job well done this month as well as DPW. Thank you and congratulations to Councilwoman Bergeron for a great job on Government Day. Barrington Day was great thanks to wonderful job from Patti Nicholson and Renee Coppola. Thanks to the Tax Office staff also a job well done this month, with special thanks to Mrs. Holcombe for all she does.

MAYOR RINK – attention to Resolution 55; trash and recycling bid has been combined with Somerdale so both towns are saving money, for Barrington about \$15,000 per year; thanks to Mike Ciocco and Greg Evans, Borough Engineer, for their work on the contract. We continue to share services for janitorial with the Board of Education. Mayor Rink, along with engineer Greg Evans, advised that the Railroad crossing at Gloucester Pike and Atlantic Ave will be repaired beginning at 6 am on July 1 and completed before parade and fireworks on July 2 around noon. DOT/Conrail will post information on project 2 weeks prior to start and notify businesses and residents along Gloucester Pike; traffic during repair will still be able to get up street as far as Berg Furniture. Memorial Day services were great as always, thanks to all who attended and participated, appreciated honoring our veterans. Have a safe and happy summer.
