

BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON
MINUTES OF MONTHLY COUNCIL MEETING
MAY 12, 2010 at 2 PM
WOODLAND SCHOOL

A regular monthly Council Meeting of the Borough of Barrington was held on May 12, 2010, at 2:00 p.m. in Woodland School with Mayor John D. Rink presiding and 8th grade students from Castle Academy and Woodland School participating in Government Day.

CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Rink welcomed all the students and said he would explain what was going on as the meeting progressed. Mayor Rink called the meeting to order and made the following statement: "This meeting is held in compliance with Chapter 231 of the open public meetings act of 1975 and appropriate notice has been given. Notice of the meeting was filed with the Retrospect and Courier Post and also in the main office of the Borough Clerk where notices are currently kept. Every one then stood and saluted the flag of our country.

Seeing no public comment, on a Motion by KLAUS and VINCENT, the Public Hearing on the 2010 Municipal Budget was closed.

Mayor Rink announced that the Municipal Budget will not be adopted until approval is received from the State.

PUBLIC PORTION: On a motion by BERGERON and DINELLA the public portion of the meeting was opened. Mayor advised if you have a comment or question to please come forward and state your name and address for the record; public comment is limited to five minutes per person.

Haley, a Woodland School student, asked that extra things be cut from the school budget and Mayor Rink advised that her question is actually for the school board and that budget is voted on in April. If the budget is voted down then it comes to Mayor & Council for review. School Board meetings are the 2nd Monday of the month.

Seeing no further comments from the public on a Motion by KLAUS and VINCENT the public portion of the meeting was closed.

We are working on this with our Economic Development Committee and I will let Councilman Popiolek know about this, Council President Klaus also works on the committee.
