Facts About Smoking and Home Fires

Smoking is the number one cause of home fire deaths in the United States. Every year, men, women and children are killed in home fires caused by cigarettes and other smoking materials. Most victims of smoking-related fires never thought it could happen to them. These fires can affect not only the smoker, but others living in or next to the home at the time of the fire.

Did you know:

- About 1000 people are killed every year from smoking material home fires.
 - People close to where a smoking material fire starts are harder to save because the fire spreads fast.
 - Most fires caused by smoking materials start on beds, furniture or in trash.
- Of the fatal victims who were not the smokers:
- Thirty-four percent were children of the smokers.

- Twenty-five percent were neighbors or friends of the smokers.
- One in four people killed in home fires is not the smoker whose cigarettes caused the fire. You can make a difference by taking the following action steps:
 - ◆ If you smoke, smoke outside.
 - ◆ Wherever you smoke, use deep, sturdy ashtrays.
 - ◆ Make sure cigarettes and ashes are out.
 - ◆ Check for butts—never put ashtrays on upholstered furniture.
 - ◆ Never smoke in a home where oxygen is used.
 - ◆ If you smoke, fire-safe cigarettes are better.
 - ◆ Be alert—if you are sleepy or have been drinking or taken medication, don't smoke!
 - ◆ Never smoke in bed!
 - ◆ Make sure your home has properly installed and working smoke detectors.
