Troop 96 Makes it to the Top of the World (er.. New Mexico)

Once again, Boy Scouts from Barrington's Troop 96 made it to the Top of The World, or it seemed like it at the time at Philmont Boy Scout Ranch in New Mexico.

Rory McPeak, John Blake and Joe Negro, along with Joe's father, Troop Treasurer Anthony Negro hiked to amazing Rocky Mountain vistas. At Philmont Ranch, donated by Waite Phillips in the 1930's, they hiked and camped as a crew for 11 days and nights over 60-100 miles of the ranch. The Ranch is on 137,000 acres (214 sq. miles) of forested mountains and flat cattle ranch. As part of a crew of 12 Boy Scouts and leaders, they were driven to and dropped off at a starting point far away from base camp where they began their 10-day trek back.

Each day they cooked a one-pot breakfast and supper


and ate packaged dry food for lunch. At about 7 AM, they packed their 25-50 lbs of gear, took down the bear bags and began hiking toward their next adventure location. At that site, they did team activities such as pole climbing, rock climbing, racing mules, climbing mountains, riding horses, firing black-powder rifles, branding, and smithing; some pretending to be mountain men like Jeremiah Johnson. What are bear bags?

At every camp site, they set up their tents and hoisted any food and gear, smelling of humans, to a height of 20 feet to protect it for the night against visits from brown bears and other non-human creatures. They often see a bear or two, mule deer, snakes and other friends of the forest along the trail. Yes, it does rain once in a while and it even sleets. There

is luxury, a shower site halfway through (maybe 2). The trail varies from 6500 to 12,440 ft high and they struggle as the air gets thin.

Once back at base camp, they look back toward their starting point, amazed at what they did over 10 days and nights. A long, hot shower and the first sit-down dinner at a restaurant are almost heaven.

You boys from Barrington and surrounding towns can do this as Boy Scouts. You can start your Scouting trek in Cub Scouts at 7-11 years old. Then you can join Boy Scouts and share monthly adventures.
