

**ORDINANCE NO. 1023**

**ACCEPTING THE GRANT OF A TEMPORARY EASEMENT RELATIVE TO BLOCK 8, LOT 2.09 ON THE OFFICIAL TAX MAP OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT SAID TEMPORARY EASEMENT**

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Barrington (hereinafter "Grantee") is a municipal entity organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey and located in Camden County, whose principal place of business is located at 229 Trenton Avenue, Barrington, New Jersey 08007; and

**WHEREAS**, the East Coast The Willows LLC (hereinafter, "Grantor") is a Delaware limited liability company doing business in the State of New Jersey, with its principal place of business located at 32 Old Slip, 28<sup>th</sup> Floor, New York, New York 10005; and

**WHEREAS**, Grantor is the owner of certain real property and the improvements thereon located on Clements Bridge Road in the Borough of Barrington, Camden County, New Jersey, also known as Block 8, Lot 2.09 ("Grantor's Parcel"); and

**WHEREAS**, Grantee is the owner of certain real property and improvements thereon located on Clements Bridge Road in the Borough of Barrington, Camden County, New Jersey, also known as Block 8, Lot 2.10 ("Grantee's Parcel"), which improvements include, among other things, a pump station located thereon (the "Pump Station"); and

**WHEREAS**, portions of the existing sanitary sewer system ("Existing Sewer System") connected to the Pump Station are located on Grantor's Parcel; and

**WHEREAS**, Grantee is proposing to abandon the Pump Station, and in order to complete the abandonment, must make improvements ("Sewer Improvements") to the portions of the Existing Sewer System located on Grantor's Parcel; and

**WHEREAS**, Grantee proposes to construct and maintain a new sanitary sewer main, manholes and a metering manhole (collectively, the "New Sewer System") across and under a portion of Grantor's Parcel; and

**WHEREAS**, Grantee desires (i) access to Grantor's Parcel for the purpose of performing the Sewer Improvements; and (ii) an easement through a portion of Grantor's Parcel for the purpose of constructing and maintaining the New Sewer System; and

**WHEREAS**, Grantor is willing to grant to Grantee (i) access to Grantor's Parcel for the purpose of performing the Sewer Improvements and (ii) an easement on Grantor's Parcel for the purposes of constructing and maintaining the New Sewer System, subject to the terms and provisions of this Agreement.

**WHEREAS**, Grantee and Grantor have agreed to the terms and conditions of this Grant of Temporary Easement; as so stated in the document attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington to authorize the proper municipal officials to execute the attached Grant of Temporary Easement on behalf of the Borough of Barrington.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, that the acceptance of the Grant of Temporary Easement, attached hereto as Exhibit "A," by and between the Borough of Barrington and East Coast The Willows, be and hereby is approved; and

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that Robert Klaus, Mayor of the Borough of Barrington and Terry Shannon, Borough Clerk of the Borough of Barrington, be and hereby are authorized to execute the Grant of Temporary Easement, attached hereto as "Exhibit A," and any and all other documents necessary to implement said Grant of Temporary Easement on behalf of the Borough of Barrington; and

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith, and that this Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to accept the conveyance of a Grant of Temporary Easement from East Coast The Willows relative to the construction and maintenance of a new sanitary sewer main, manholes and a metering manhole across and under a portion of Grantor's Parcel, more particularly described as Block 8, Lot 2.09 in the Borough of Barrington. A copy of this Ordinance is available at no charge to the general public between the hours of 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday (Legal Holidays excluded), at the Office of the Borough Clerk, Barrington Borough Hall, 229 Trenton Avenue, Barrington, New Jersey.

**ORDINANCE NO. 1022**  
**OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND**  
**STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 95, PROPERTY**  
**MAINTENANCE, IN THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF**  
**BARRINGTON**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey, that Chapter 95, Property Maintenance, in the Code of the Borough of Barrington, is amended as follows:

**ARTICLE I. SECTION 95-3. Definitions.**

The following definition is amended in the Code of the Borough of Barrington. All other definitions contained in Section 95-3 of this Chapter are retained in their entirety:

**OPERATOR:** Any person, persons or entity who is not the owner, who has charge, care and control of a premises or part thereof, with or without the knowledge, consent or authority of the owner. Operator shall also include a creditor, as defined in P.L.2014, c.5, that has served a notice of intention to foreclose on a mortgage on a residential property pursuant to P.L. 1995, c.244, and that property has become vacant after the filing of this intention to foreclose.

**ARTICLE II. SECTION 95-12. Enforcement.**

- A. Retained in its entirety.
- B. Retained in its entirety, except that the abatement period referenced in this Section as fourteen (14) days is hereby amended to five (5) days.
- C. Service of notice.
  - 1. Retained in its entirety.
  - 2. Retained in its entirety.
  - 3. Notice; Alternate service. In the event that personal service cannot be made, or in the event that service by certified mail is not accepted, service shall be accomplished by posting said notice in a conspicuous place on the premises, or by electronic mail to an e-mail address provided by the property owner, operator or occupant, with a "Read Receipt Request" provided.
  - 4. If the owner of a residential property vacates or abandons any property on which a foreclosure proceeding has been initiated, or if a residential property becomes vacant at any point subsequent to the operator's filing the summons and complaint in an action to foreclose on a mortgage against the subject property, but prior to vesting of title in the operator or any other third party, and the property is found to be a nuisance and/or in violation of any of the provisions of this Chapter, the Code Enforcement Officer shall notify the operator, which shall have the responsibility to abate the nuisance and/or correct the violation in the same manner and to the same extent as the title owner of the property, to such standard or specification as may be required by State law or this Chapter. The Borough shall include a description of the conditions that gave rise to the violation with the notice of violation, and shall provide a period of not less than 30 days from the operator's receipt

owner, operator and/or occupier of any such land shall be valid for subsequent remedial action to the property a period of one hundred twenty (120) days from the expiration of five (5) days following service and/or posting of notice as provided in Section 95-12(C) of this chapter.

**ARTICLE VI. SECTION 95-14 Violations; penalties.**

A. Retained in its entirety.

B. Any owner, operator or occupant who or which shall violate any of the provisions of this Chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable for penalties or any combination thereof as set forth in Chapter 1-15 of the Code of the Borough of Barrington, in the discretion of the Judge of the Municipal Court before whom such violation is heard and conviction made, but in no event shall the fine be less than \$250.00. Each day that a violation occurs shall be deemed a separate and distinct violation, subject to the penalty provisions of this Chapter.

C. Retained in its entirety.

**ARTICLE V.**

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.

**ARTICLE VI.**

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.

**ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY APPROVING THE PURCHASE OF AN EASEMENT OVER CERTAIN LAND BY THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON FROM MEDFORD VILLAGE EAST ASSOCIATES LLC**

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Barrington (hereinafter "Barrington") is a municipal entity organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey and located in Camden County; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-5(a) authorizes a municipality to acquire lands or rights therein by purchase, gift, condemnation or otherwise in the manner provided by said statute.

**WHEREAS**, Barrington has determined that it is necessary to acquire for purposes of sewer replacement/repair an easement over a portion of the land and premises commonly referred to as 1300 Clements Bridge Road, hereinafter described; and

**WHEREAS**, the Medford Village East Associates LLC ("Medford Village East") is the owner of real property located at 1300 Clements Bridge Road, more fully described as Lot 2.08 in Block 8 on the Official Tax Map of the Borough of Barrington; and

**WHEREAS**, Barrington has made a bona fide offer to purchase the above referenced easement from Medford Village East Associates for consideration in the amount of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars; and

**WHEREAS**, this bona fide offer to purchase this easement, which was made by Barrington, has been rejected by Medford Village East Associates; and

**WHEREAS**, Barrington wishes to assert its rights of eminent domain and commence a condemnation action to acquire this easement over the property from Medford Village East Associates; and

**WHEREAS**, through subsequent negotiations, Barrington and Medford Village East Associates have agreed to the purchase of the easement for consideration in the amount of Seven Thousand, Five Hundred (\$7,500.00) Dollars, together with certain conditions relative to the future use of the property, as contained in the proposed Consent Order, attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

**WHEREAS**, the purchase of this property by Barrington is consistent with and in furtherance of a public purpose; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the intention of the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington to authorize the proper municipal officials to prosecute this litigation and execute the appropriate

documents on behalf of the Borough of Barrington in furtherance of the purchase of this easement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, State of New Jersey that, pursuant to and in furtherance of the authority granted to the municipality under the Eminent Domain Act, N.J.S.A. 20:3-1 et seq., the purchase of an easement over the real property located at 1300 Clements Bridge Road, in the Borough of Barrington, more fully described as Lot 2.08 in Block 8 on the Official Tax Map of the Borough of Barrington from the Medford Village East Associates LLC, in the amount of Seven Thousand, Five Hundred (\$7,500.00) Dollars, together with certain conditions relative to the future use of the property, as contained in the proposed Consent Order, attached hereto as Exhibit A, be and hereby is approved; and

**AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that Robert Klaus, Mayor of the Borough of Barrington and Terry Shannon, Borough Clerk of the Borough of Barrington be and hereby are authorized to execute the appropriate documents to implement said purchase on behalf of the Borough of Barrington; and

**AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that the Timothy J. Higgins, Esquire, Borough Solicitor of the Borough of Barrington, be and hereby is authorized to prepare and file in the Superior Court any and all documents to implement said purchase on behalf of the Borough of Barrington.

**RESOLUTION CHANGING CUSTODIAN OF THE PETTY CASH FUND AND THE MONETARY AMOUNT**

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-21 authorizes the establishment of a Petty Cash Fund; and

**WHEREAS**, the Division of Local Government Services had in its records that Joseph Kaiser was custodian of a Petty Cash Fund in the amount of \$500.00; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-21, the Borough of Barrington is changing the custodian to the Municipal Clerk who is currently Terry Shannon; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden that the petty cash fund for the Clerk's Office be decreased from \$500.00 to \$200.00; and

**WHEREAS**, Terry Shannon is bonded in the amount of \$1,000.00 by virtue of a surety bond.
