ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY APPROVING THE PURCHASE OF AN EASEMENT OVER CERTAIN LAND BY THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON FROM MEDFORD VILLAGE EAST ASSOCIATES LLC

WHEREAS, the Borough of Barrington (hereinafter "Barrington") is a municipal entity organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey and located in Camden County; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-5(a) authorizes a municipality to acquire lands or rights therein by purchase, gift, condemnation or otherwise in the manner provided by said statute.

WHEREAS, Barrington has determined that it is necessary to acquire for purposes of sewer replacement/repair an easement over a portion of the land and premises commonly referred to as 1300 Clements Bridge Road, hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, the Medford Village East Associates LLC ("Medford Village East") is the owner of real property located at 1300 Clements Bridge Road, more fully described as Lot 2.08 in Block 8 on the Official Tax Map of the Borough of Barrington; and

WHEREAS, Barrington has made a bona fide offer to purchase the above referenced easement from Medford Village East Associates for consideration in the amount of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars; and

WHEREAS, this bona fide offer to purchase this easement, which was made by Barrington, has been rejected by Medford Village East Associates; and

WHEREAS, Barrington wishes to assert its rights of eminent domain and commence a condemnation action to acquire this easement over the property from Medford Village East Associates; and

WHEREAS, through subsequent negotiations, Barrington and Medford Village East Associates have agreed to the purchase of the easement for consideration in the amount of Seven Thousand, Five Hundred (\$7,500.00) Dollars, together with certain conditions relative to the future use of the property, as contained in the proposed Consent Order, attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the purchase of this property by Barrington is consistent with and in furtherance of a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington to authorize the proper municipal officials to prosecute this litigation and execute the appropriate

documents on behalf of the Borough of Barrington in furtherance of the purchase of this easement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, State of New Jersey that, pursuant to and in furtherance of the authority granted to the municipality under the Eminent Domain Act, N.J.S.A. 20:3-1 et seq., the purchase of an easement over the real property located at 1300 Clements Bridge Road, in the Borough of Barrington, more fully described as Lot 2.08 in Block 8 on the Official Tax Map of the Borough of Barrington from the Medford Village East Associates LLC, in the amount of Seven Thousand, Five Hundred (\$7,500.00) Dollars, together with certain conditions relative to the future use of the property, as contained in the proposed Consent Order, attached hereto as Exhibit A, be and hereby is approved; and

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that Robert Klaus, Mayor of the Borough of Barrington and Terry Shannon, Borough Clerk of the Borough of Barrington be and hereby are authorized to execute the appropriate documents to implement said purchase on behalf of the Borough of Barrington; and

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Timothy J. Higgins, Esquire, Borough Solicitor of the Borough of Barrington, be and hereby is authorized to prepare and file in the Superior Court any and all documents to implement said purchase on behalf of the Borough of Barrington.

ORDINANCE NO. 1025

AMENDING CHAPTER 29, POLICE DEPARTMENT, OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey that Section 29, Police Department, is hereby amended in the Code of the Borough of Barrington, as follows:

ARTICLE I. SECTION 29-8. Appointment of special police officers.

The Borough Council may appoint special law enforcement officers in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:14-146.8 et seq., to be utilized by the Police Chief. Their terms may not exceed one year, and such appointment may be revoked without cause or hearing. They shall possess and exercise all the powers and duties provided by said statutes during their term in office, but shall not be continued as regular members of the Police Department and shall not be entitled to tenure. The special police officer's powers, rights and duties shall immediately cease at the expiration of the term for which they were appointed, or upon revocation of their appointment. They may be furnished with a badge upon the deposit of a sum to be fixed by the Borough Council, which may be refunded upon return of the badge.

ARTICLE II. SECTION 29-8.1. Qualifications of special police; conduct in office.

A. No person shall be appointed as a special police officer unless he/she is a citizen of the United States; able to read, write and speak the English language; physically qualified and of good moral character; and shall not have been convicted of any crime. No such special police officer shall carry a revolver or other weapon when off duty. Every special police officer shall be fingerprinted, and his fingerprints shall be filed with the Division of State Police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

B. Every such special police officer shall be under the supervision and direction of the Chief of Police or officer in charge of the Police Department.

C. Every such special police officer shall comply with the Police Department's rules and regulations promulgated by the Borough Council for the conduct and decorum of the regular members of the Police Department.

D. Before any such appointment is made, the Chief of Police shall ascertain whether the applicant for the appointment is eligible and qualified, as provided by statute, and a written report shall be made to the Borough Council.

E. Said written report shall be made by the Chief of Police within two weeks of the date the same is requested by the Borough Council, and said written report shall list the findings of the Chief of Police in detail. Following the receipt of such written report, the Borough Council shall determine whether to appoint said special police officer and, in conjunction therewith, may make an independent investigation and appraisal of such applicant or proposed appointee.

ARTICLE III.

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.

ARTICLE IV.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.

This Ordinance will be considered for adoption on final reading and public hearing to be held on September 9, 2014 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Meeting Room, Barrington Borough Hall, 229 Trenton Avenue, Barrington, New Jersey.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide for the hiring and utilization of special law enforcement officers by the Barrington Police Department. A copy of this Ordinance is available at no charge to the general public between the hours of 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday (Legal Holidays excluded), at the Office of the Borough Clerk, Barrington Municipal Building, 229 Trenton Avenue, Barrington, New Jersey.

RESOLUTION 8-2014-74

OPPOSING THE PASSAGE OF BILLS A-947/S-2216

WHEREAS, A-947/S-2216 would require municipalities, counties and local authorities to release the names, upon request, of all parties who have received bid documents prior to the bid opening once three or more bid packets have been obtained; and

WHEREAS, the release of the bidders' list would have to be made available in a timely manner in accordance with the Open Public Records Act and the municipalities will have the option to post the list on their websites; and

WHEREAS, failure to release this information would prohibit a municipality from accepting the bids and require the re-advertisement for bids; and

WHEREAS, the Appellate Division's decision in O'Neill Electric Co., Inc. v. the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Warren, 297 N.J. Super. 473 (App. Div. 1997) stated that "access to a bidders list facilitates collusive or bid-rigging arrangements and that withholding disclosure makes this more difficult." Id. at 480. The Court went on to say that bid rigging is an "extremely serious problem, which costs the public enormous sums of money. The relatively insignificant interest of plaintiff and amici in obtaining bidders lists cannot overcome the grave danger to the public resulting from a failure to keep the door tightly closed to potential corruption in public bidding." Id.; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Barrington agrees with the court in the O'Neill decision and we are concerned that the release of the bidders' names prior to the receipt of bids could lead to collusion and bid rigging; and

WHEREAS, the benchmark of "three or more bids" before the release of the bidders' list is an arbitrary benchmark that will lead to costly litigation; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of A-947/S-2216 will require a municipality to create and maintain a record; and

WHEREAS, contractors have long argued that release of the bidder's list may force contractors to "sharpen their pencils." The governing body of Barrington questions why can't these "pencils be sharpened" regardless of the number of bidders or who is bidding on the project; and

WHEREAS, that the governing body of the Borough of Barrington strongly supports an open and competitive bidding process and the release of bidders after a bid opening;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing body of the Borough of Barrington strongly opposes A-947/S-2216;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this duly adopted resolution be sent to Governor Christie, Senate President Sweeney, Senator Donald Norcross, and the League of Municipalities.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Oaklyn is a municipal entity organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey and located in Camden County ("Oaklyn"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Barrington (hereinafter "Barrington") is a municipal entity organized under the laws of the State of New Jersey and located in Camden County; and

WHEREAS, Oaklyn and Barrington have entered into negotiations as to the creation and operation of a shared municipal court pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, Oaklyn and Barrington intend by virtue of this document to set forth the terms and conditions of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the proper and respective municipal officials will be authorized to execute this Shared Services Agreement pursuant to the Ordinances and Resolutions of the Oaklyn Borough Council and the Barrington Borough Council, attached hereto and made a part of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution is necessary to permit the Mayor and Borough Clerk of the Borough of Barrington to execute this Shared Services Agreement on behalf of the Borough of Barrington;
