ORDINANCE NO. 1034

CALENDAR YEAR 2015 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 1.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington in the County of Camden finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2015 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that a 2.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$107,102.73 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington, in the County of Camden, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2015 budget year, the final appropriations of the Barrington shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$187,429.79 and that the CY 2015 municipal budget for the Barrington be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within five days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, shall be filed with said Director within five days after such adoption.

BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON ORDINANCE NO. 1036

ARTICLE VII. CHICKENS, TO CHAPTER 48, ANIMALS, IN THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey, that Article VII. of Chapter 48, Animals, in the Code of the Borough of Barrington, is added as follows:

ARTICLE I. ARTICLE VII. SECTION 48-21. Chickens permitted; Pilot Program

This ordinance is a pilot program for the keeping of "Backyard Chickens". Keeping of "Backyard Chickens" shall be permitted in the Borough of Barrington subject to the rules and regulations as specified in this ordinance. This ordinance shall expire as of June 30, 2016, unless permanently adopted by the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington.

ARTICLE II. ARTICLE VII. SECTION 48-22. Location; number restricted.

No chickens shall be kept within twenty (20) feet of any structure owned by another and used for human habitation, occupation or assembly, provided that in no case shall any person or persons be permitted to keep more than four (4) chickens. No chickens shall be permitted to run or stray within twenty (20) feet of such structure.

ARTICLE III. ARTICLE VII. SECTION 48-23. License required; fee; expiration.

No person shall keep chickens on their property without having first obtained a license from the license issuing authority. The annual fee shall be in the amount of \$10.00, and shall expire on December 31 of each year. Licenses shall be renewed annually.

ARTICLE IV. ARTICLE VII. SECTION 48-24. Requirements for coops.

The following regulations and conditions for the keeping and housing of chickens shall be complied with:

- A. The coop shall be dry and well ventilated, with windows so placed, if possible, as to admit sunlight.
- B. The coop shall be well whitewashed or painted therein.
- C. The coop shall be cleaned at least once a week between November 1 and May 1,

twice a week between May 1 and November 1 and, if necessary, to be cleaned more often and to be disinfected.

- D. Perches shall be removable and kept clean.
- E. Chicken nests shall be removable, cleaned, aired and sunned at frequent intervals.
- F. Drinking fountains in the area where the coop is located shall be cleaned and supplied at all times with clean water.
- G. The yard in the area where the coop is located shall be clean and free from odors.
- H. Coops shall be inspected annually by the issuing authority or upon receipt of a complaint. Property owner shall grant access for the coops to be inspected.

ARTICLE V. ARTICLE VII. SECTION 48-25. Revocation of license.

If the above conditions and regulations are not complied with the license shall be revoked, provided that nothing herein shall apply to the chicken coops in regular licensed markets or stores for the sale, slaughter and plucking of poultry.

ARTICLE VI. ARTICLE VII. SECTION 48-26. Revocation due to environmental changes.

Whenever, in the opinion of the Health Official, the environment in an area has changed since granting the license to keep and maintain chickens therein to such an extent that the maintenance thereof may constitute a nuisance, such license may be revoked by the Health Official.

ARTICLE VII. ARTICLE VII. SECTION 48-27. Procedure for revocation or suspension hearing.

The Health Official is hereby empowered to suspend or revoke the license held by any person who violates any of the provisions of this Article. No license shall be suspended or revoked until after a hearing. A notice of five (5) days, in writing, stating the time and place of such hearing, shall be served upon the licensee.

ARTICLE VIII. ARTICLE VII. SECTION 48-28. Time of Ordinance, termination.

The provisions of this Article, unless renewed by the Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, shall expire and become inoperative at 12:01 am on July 1, 2016.

ARTICLE IX.

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.

ARTICLE X.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1037

**FIXING THE 2015 COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AND
EMPLOYEES OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington as follows:

SECTION 1. The following are the maximum annual base salaries to be paid to the respective employees and officers of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, while in the employ of the Borough of Barrington effective January 1, 2015, unless otherwise noted:

SECTION 6. Longevity will be added to the base salary for all non-union, full-time employees hired before 1/1/96, based upon the following schedule:

SECTION 7. The compensation herein specified shall take effect as indicated, and shall apply thereto unless and until, the same have been changed as provided by law.

SECTION 8. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

¹ The \$58,656.00 salary shown for the Municipal Clerk is based on a 35 hour week, 52 weeks per year while performing the duties of Municipal Clerk for the Borough of Barrington. This position is part of a shared service with the Borough of Mount Ephraim. The additional salary for the Mount Ephraim position is \$15,145.00. The combined total salary is \$73,801. Should the shared service be dissolved, that additional salary shall end as of the termination date of the Shared Service Agreement.

² The \$58,596.00 salary shown for the Finance Officer is based on a 35 hour week, 52 weeks per year while performing the duties of Finance Officer for the Borough of Barrington. This position is part of a shared service with the Borough of Merchantville. The additional salary for the Merchantville position is \$27,234.00. The combined total salary is \$85,830.00. Should the shared service be dissolved, the additional salary shall end as of the termination date of the Shared Service Agreement.

³ The \$54,037.00 salary shown for the Tax Collector/Sewer Rent Collector is based on a 35 hour week, 52 weeks per year while performing the duties of Tax Collector/Sewer Rent Collector for the Borough of Barrington. This position is part of a shared service with the Borough of Merchantville as Tax Collector and the Borough of Runnemede as Payroll Clerk. The additional salary for the Merchantville position is \$16,320.00 and the additional salary for the Runnemede position is \$10,710.00. The combined total salary is \$81,067.00. Should either shared service be dissolved, that additional annual salary shall end as of the termination date of the relevant Shared Service Agreement.

ORDINANCE NO. 1038

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 46, ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, IN THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey, that Chapter 46, Alcoholic Beverages, is hereby amended to the Code of the Borough of Barrington, as follows:

ARTICLE I. SECTION 46-2 License required; fees

A. The following license fees shall be set for each licensed year:

- (1) Plenary retail consumption license; one thousand three hundred sixty eight dollars (\$1368.00) per annum.
- (2) Plenary retail distribution license: one thousand one hundred sixteen dollars (\$1116.00.) per annum.
- (3) Club license: one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.) per annum.

ARTICLE II.

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.

ARTICLE III.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.

WHEREAS, this Resolution is necessary to permit the Mayor and Borough Clerk of the Borough of Barrington to execute this Shared Services Agreement on behalf of the Borough of Barrington;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, State of New Jersey that, pursuant to Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq., the Shared Services Agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A", authorizing the sharing of the services provided by the Borough of Barrington for office support services by the Borough of Tavistock, be and hereby is approved.

RESOLUTION NO. 5-2015-61

RESOLUTION REQUESTING APPROVAL OF ITEMS OF REVENUE AND EXPENSE

WHEREAS, NJS 40A:4-87 provides that the Director of the Division of Local Government Services may approve the insertion of any special item of revenue in the budget of any county or municipality when such item shall have been made available by law and the amount thereof was not determined at the time of the adoption of the budget; and

WHEREAS, the Director may also approve the insertion of an appropriation for the equal amount;




