**ORDINANCE NO. 1054**

**FIXING THE 2016 COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AND  
EMPLOYEES OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON**

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The following are the maximum annual base salaries to be paid to the respective employees and officers of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, while in the employ of the Borough of Barrington effective January 1, 2016, unless otherwise noted:

Chief of Police	111,000
Sup't of Public Works (includes longevity)	91,588
Foreman of Public Works (includes longevity)	72,306
Municipal Clerk <sup>1</sup>	63,000
Finance Officer <sup>2</sup>	61,200
Tax Collector/Sewer Rent Collector <sup>3</sup>	57,000
Secretary to Mayor and Council /AP Clerk	46,127

The above wages will be divided by 52 to determine the weekly amount.

**SECTION 2.** Wages to be paid to persons performing any other work except as described herein, and which employee or officer is not covered by a union contract, shall be paid the sum of minimum wage to \$11.00 per hour, with time and one-half for overtime when approved by the department head.

**SECTION 3.** Wages to be paid to the following part-time employees are fixed at the indicated hourly rates EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2016:

**SECTION 6.** Longevity will be added to the base salary for all non-union, full-time employees hired before 1/1/96, based upon the following schedule:

- Beginning of 6<sup>th</sup> year through the 10<sup>th</sup> year – 3%
- Beginning of 11<sup>th</sup> year through the 15<sup>th</sup> year – 6%
- Beginning of 16<sup>th</sup> year through end of employment – 8%

**SECTION 7.** The compensation herein specified shall take effect as indicated, and shall apply thereto unless and until, the same have been changed as provided by law.





**EXHIBIT A.**

<sup>1</sup> The \$63,000 salary shown for the Municipal Clerk is based on a 35 hour week, 52 weeks per year while performing the duties of Municipal Clerk for the Borough of Barrington. This position is part of a shared service with the Borough of Mount Ephraim. The additional salary for the Mount Ephraim position is \$15,600. The combined total salary is \$78,600. Should the shared service be dissolved, that additional salary shall end as of the termination date of the Shared Service Agreement.

<sup>2</sup> The \$61,200 salary shown for the Finance Officer is based on a 35 hour week, 52 weeks per year while performing the duties of Finance Officer for the Borough of Barrington. This position is part of a shared service with the Borough of Merchantville. The additional salary for the Merchantville position is \$28,051. The combined total salary is \$89,251. Should the shared service be dissolved, the additional salary shall end as of the termination date of the Shared Service Agreement.

<sup>3</sup> The \$57,000 salary shown for the Tax Collector/Sewer Rent Collector is based on a 35 hour week, 52 weeks per year while performing the duties of Tax Collector/Sewer Rent Collector for the Borough of Barrington. This position is part of a shared service with the Borough of Merchantville as Tax Collector and the Borough of Runnemede as Payroll Clerk. The additional salary for the Merchantville position is \$16,483 and the additional salary for the Runnemede position is \$10,817. The combined total salary is \$84,300. Should either shared service be dissolved, that additional annual salary shall end as of the termination date of the relevant Shared Service Agreement.

**ORDINANCE NO. 1055**

**OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF  
NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 29, POLICE DEPARTMENT, OF THE  
CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey that Section 29, Police Department, is hereby amended in the Code of the Borough of Barrington, as follows:

**ARTICLE I. SECTION 29-8.3 Appointment of police chaplain; qualifications.**

In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:14-141 et seq., the Mayor may appoint, with the advice and consent of the Borough Council, a chaplain for the Barrington Police Department. The person appointed as chaplain shall be an ordained clergyperson in good standing in the religious body from which he or she is selected. Said chaplain shall become a member of the Barrington Police Department, without rank and without salary. Said appointment shall be for a period not to exceed one (1) year, and shall expire on December 31 of each calendar year.

**ARTICLE II.**

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.



**ORDINANCE NO. 1056**

**FIXING THE COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON COVERED BY THE AFSCME, COUNCIL 71, CONTRACT**

**BE IT ORDAINED**, By the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Barrington as follows:

Section 1. The following represents the hourly rates and/or ranges for the respective employees and of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, while in the employ of the Borough of Barrington. The compensation shall apply to those employees of the Borough of Barrington as of the effective date of this ordinance and shall be retroactive to January 1, 2016:

Secretary to Police Chief/Matron	\$8.00 - \$23.83 per hour
Secretary to Public Works/Construction	\$8.00 - \$22.36 per hour
Deputy Tax Collector/Deputy Assessor	\$8.00 - \$17.35 per hour

**SECTION 4:** The compensation for the employees as herein designated shall take effect as indicated and shall apply thereto unless and until, the same have been changes as provided by law.

**SECTION 5:** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION 6:** Be it further resolved that these increases will increase by 3% and 3% in each of the successive two years respectively as provided for in the contract dated January 1, 2016, through December 31, 2018.

**BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS PIECES OF CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND THE COMPLETION OF VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$434,000 THEREFOR; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY, IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF UP TO \$222,300, MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS AND COVENANTS; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE FOREGOING**

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**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, constituting Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

**Section 1.** The purposes described in Section 7 hereof are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, New Jersey ("Borough").

**Section 2.** It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- (a) the estimated amount to be raised by the Borough from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$434,000;
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$222,300; and
- (c) a down payment in the amount of \$11,700 for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is currently available in accordance with the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11.

**Section 3.** The sum of \$222,300, to be raised by the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, together with the sum of \$11,700, which amount represents the required down payment, and the sum of \$200,000, which amount represents a grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation, are hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").

**Section 4.** The issuance of negotiable bonds of the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$222,300 to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law.

**Section 5.** In order to temporarily finance the purposes described in Section 7 hereof, the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$222,300 is hereby authorized. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell all or part of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their date to delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date

when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this Bond Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

**Section 6.** The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, accounting, engineering, legal fees and other items as provided in Section 20 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20, shall not exceed the sum of \$85,000.

**Section 7.** The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which said obligations are to be issued; the estimated costs of each said purpose; the amount of down payment for each said purpose; the amount of available grants; the maximum amount of obligations to be issued for said purpose and the period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law are as follows:

**Section 8.** Grants in addition to those identified in Section 7 above or other monies received from any governmental entity, if any, will be applied to the payment of, or repayment of obligations issued to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 above.

**Section 9.** The average period of useful life of the purposes for the financing of which the Bond Ordinance authorizes the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized for such several purposes, is not less than 7.88 years.

**Section 10.** The supplemental debt statement provided for in Section 10 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10, was duly filed in the office of the Clerk prior to the passage of this Bond Ordinance on first reading and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43, is increased by this Bond Ordinance by \$222,300 and that the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

**Section 11.** The full faith and credit of the Borough are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance, and to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

**Section 12.** The Capital Budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk and available for inspection.

**Section 13.** The Borough hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance pursuant to Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(e), promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), for "original expenditures", as defined in Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(c)(2), made by the Borough prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

**Section 14.** The Borough hereby covenants as follows:

(a) it shall take all actions necessary to ensure that the interest paid on the bonds or bond anticipation notes is exempt from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes, and will not become a specific item of tax preference pursuant to Section 57(a)(5) of the Code;

(b) it will not make any use of the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes or do or suffer any other action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder;

(c) it shall calculate or cause to be calculated and pay, when due, the rebatable arbitrage with respect to the "gross proceeds" (as such term is used in Section 148(f) of the Code) of the bonds or bond anticipation notes;

(d) it shall timely file with the Internal Revenue Service, such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and

(e) it shall take no action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.

**Section 15.** The improvements authorized hereby are not current expenses and are improvements that the Borough may lawfully make. No part of the cost of the improvements authorized hereby has been or shall be specially assessed on any property specially benefited thereby.

**Section 16.** All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency.

**Section 17.** In accordance with the Local Bond Law, this Bond Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

**WHEREAS**, a large percentage of the motor vehicle occupants killed in traffic crashes were not wearing a seat belt; and

**WHEREAS**, use of a seat belt remains the most effective way to avoid death or serious injury in a motor vehicle crash; and

**WHEREAS**, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration estimates that 135,000 lives were saved by safety belt usage nationally between 1975-2000; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of New Jersey will participate in the nationwide *Click It or Ticket* seat belt mobilization from May 23 – June 5, 2016 in an effort to raise awareness and increase seat belt usage through a combination of high visibility enforcement and public education; and


**WHEREAS**, the Division of Highway Traffic Safety has set a goal of increasing the seat belt usage rate in the state from the current level of 91% to 93%; and

**WHEREAS**, a further increase in seat belt usage in New Jersey will save lives on our roadways;




