

BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON
MINUTES OF MONTHLY COUNCIL MEETING
JULY 11, 2017, 6:00 PM
COUNCIL ROOM AT MUNICIPAL BUILDING

A regular monthly Council Meeting of the Borough of Barrington was held with Mayor Klaus presiding.

CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Klaus called the meeting to order with the following statement: "This meeting is held in compliance with Chapter 231 of the open public meetings act of 1975 and appropriate notice has been given. Notice of the meeting was filed with the Retrospect and Courier Post and is also posted in the main office of the Borough Clerk where notices are primarily kept. He then led the salute to the flag of our country.

ROLL CALL: The Municipal Clerk called roll of Council and with the following in attendance: Councilwoman Harris, Councilman Robenolt, Council President Popiolek and Councilman Beach. Also on dais: Mayor Klaus, Municipal Clerk Terry Shannon and Borough Solicitor, Timothy Higgins, Esq.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Mayor Klaus noted that Council was provided with a copy of the printed minutes of the June 7, 2017, Caucus and the June 13, 2017, council meeting and asked if there were any corrections. Seeing none, on a Motion by Popiolek, second by Harris, the caucus minutes (with Councilman Robenolt abstaining) and council minutes were approved by all members of Council present.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: The Municipal Clerk read a summary of the June 2017, monthly reports as submitted by Chief David Uron for Police, Chief Jason Houck for the Fire Company; Chief Barbara Willson for the EMS/Ambulance; Tax Collector Kristy Emmett for Tax and Sewer Collections; Chris Mecca for the Construction Department; Administrator Catherine Lawson for Municipal Court and Superintendent Michael J. Ciocco for Recycling. On a Motion by Robenolt, second by Harris, the monthly reports were approved as submitted by all members of Council present.

On a motion by Harris, second by Robenolt, the public hearing was opened. The Mayor asked if there were any questions or comments on these ordinances. Seeing none, on a motion by Popiolek, second by Beach, the public hearing was closed.
