

What It Is.

The Atlantic Avenue Rail-with-Trail project envisions a 10-mile biking and walking trail that will run between East and West Atlantic Avenue, connecting 12 communities to important destinations throughout Camden—schools, universities, hospitals, museums, parks, waterfronts and jobs.

Over time, the project will connect to the Circuit Trails, a 750-mile trail network that spans nine counties between greater Philadelphia and New Jersey.

Why It Matters.

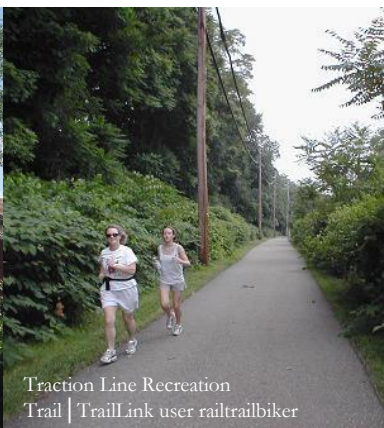
Right now, there are few designated places to walk or bike safely in many of the towns along Atlantic Avenue—people often use the busy road to get around on foot or by bike. The Atlantic Avenue Rail-with-Trail project is designed to add new walking and biking infrastructure in the county, introducing a beautiful urban walking and biking trail parallel to the traffic on this busy county road.
