PROCLAMATION

DECLARING THE FIRST FRIDAY IN JUNE TO BE NATIONAL GUN VIOLENCE AWARENESS DAY

This proclamation declares the first Friday in June to be National Gun Violence Awareness Day in the Borough of Barrington to honor and remember all victims and survivors of gun violence and to declare that we as a country must do more to reduce gun violence.

WHEREAS, every day, 96 Americans are killed by gun violence and on average there are nearly 13,000 gun homicides every year; and

WHEREAS, Americans are 25 times more likely to be killed with guns than people in other developed countries; and

WHEREAS, protecting public safety in the communities they serve is mayors' highest responsibility; and

WHEREAS, support for the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens goes hand-inhand with keeping guns away from dangerous people; and

WHEREAS, mayors and law enforcement officers know their communities best, are the most familiar with local criminal activity and how to address it, and are best positioned to understand how to keep their citizens safe; and

WHEREAS, in January 2013, Hadiya Pendleton, a teenager who marched in President Obama's second inaugural parade and was tragically shot and killed just weeks later, should have be now celebrating her 21st birthday; and

WHEREAS, to help honor Hadiya – and the 96 Americans whose lives are cut short and the countless survivors who are injured by shootings every day – a national coalition of organizations has designated June 1st, 2018, the first Friday in June, as the 4th National Gun Violence Awareness Day; and

WHEREAS, the idea was inspired by a group of Hadiya's friends, who asked their classmates to commemorate her life by wearing orange; they chose this color because hunters wear orange to announce themselves to other hunters when out in the woods and orange is a color that symbolizes the value of human life; and

WHEREAS, anyone can join this campaign by pledging to Wear Orange on June 1st, the first Friday in June in 2018, to help raise awareness about gun violence; and

WHEREAS, by wearing orange on June 1, 2018 Americans will raise awareness about gun violence and honor the lives of gun violence victims and survivors; and

WHEREAS, we renew our commitment to reduce gun violence and pledge to do all we can to keep firearms out of the wrong hands, and encourage responsible gun ownership to help keep our children safe.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington declares the first Friday in June, June 1, 2018, to be National Gun Violence Awareness Day. I encourage all citizens to support their local communities' efforts to prevent the tragic effects of gun violence and to honor and value human lives.

ORDINANCE NO. 1088

FIXING THE 2018 COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington as follows:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> The following are the maximum annual base salaries to be paid to the respective employees and officers of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, while in the employ of the Borough of Barrington effective January 1, 2018, unless otherwise noted:

- ³ The \$64,960 salary shown for the Tax Collector/Sewer Rent Collector is based on a 35 hour week, 52 weeks per year while performing the duties of Tax Collector/Sewer Rent Collector for the Borough of Barrington. This position is part of a shared service with the Borough of Merchantville as Tax Collector and the Borough of Runnemede as Payroll Clerk. ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 59, FIRE PREVENTION, IN THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey that Chapter 59, Fire Prevention, is hereby amended in the Code of the Borough of Barrington, as follows:

- B. Reports. The fee for a Fire Code Status Report shall be \$90.00.
- **C.** Application. Application shall be made to the Fire Official for the uses and/or activities set forth in 59-8A. No application for a permit shall be acted upon unless such application is submitted ten (10) working days prior to an inspection.

ARTICLE II. SECTION 59-9 Inspection of non-life hazard uses.

- A. The local enforcing agency established by 59-2 shall carry out inspections, once every twelve (12) months, of non-life-hazard uses and/or activities. The inspection fees for non-life hazard uses and/or activities shall be as follows:
- (1) Residential buildings with dwelling units not listed as life-hazard by the New Jersey Bureau of Fire Safety, except one- or two-family owner-occupied units:

AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH CAMDEN COUNTY IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY RELATIVE TO THE EMERGENCY SERVICES BUILDING ROOF PROJECT

WHEREAS the Borough of Barrington is in need of procuring an entity to provide services for project management of the New Roof for the Emergency Services Building; and

WHEREAS the Camden County Improvement Authority (CCIA) has the expertise and capability to provide comprehensive services to Barrington for management of this project;

WHEREAS the terms and conditions of this Agreement are spelled out in the Shared Services Agreement (a copy of which is annexed hereto) and have been agreed to by all parties; and

WHEREAS the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington agrees that it is in the best interest of the Borough to execute the Shared Services Agreement with CCIA for management of the New Roof for the Emergency Services Building;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington that the Shared Services Agreement with Camden County Improvement Authority for management of the New Roof for the Emergency Services Building project is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to sign any and all documents related hereto.
