ORDINANCE NO. 1097

VACATING A PORTION OF A CERTAIN RIGHT-OF-WAY WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of every municipality in the State of New Jersey may make, amend, repeal and enforce Ordinances to "establish, change the grade of or vacate any public street, highway, lane or alley, or any part thereof, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:67-1(b); and

WHEREAS, under said statute, any vacation ordinance adopted pursuant to this section shall expressly reserve and except from vacation all rights and privileges then possessed by public utilities, as defined in N.J.S.A. 48:2-13, and by any cable television company, as defined in the "Cable Television Act", to maintain, repair and replace their existing facilities in, adjacent to, over or under the street, highway, lane, alley, square, place or park, or any part thereof, to be vacated; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington has determined that the public rights and interest would best be served by vacating certain portions of the right-of-way of Avon Road, described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and made a part hereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

ARTICLE I.

The public rights and interest in the portions of Avon Road be and hereby are vacated, abandoned and released, excepting from vacation and expressly reserving all rights and privileges possessed by public or private utilities, as defined in N.J.S.A. 48:2-13, and by any cable company as defined in the "Cable Television Act," N.J.S.A. 48:5A-1, et. seq., to repair or replace their existing facilities in, adjacent to, over or under the street or portion thereof, as more particularly described on Exhibit "A" as attached hereto.

ARTICLE II.

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.

ARTICLE III.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1098

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 93, PEDDLING AND SOLICITING, IN THE BOROUGH CODE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey that Article I of Chapter 93, Peddling and Soliciting, is hereby amended to the Code of the Borough of Barrington, as follows:

ARTICLE I. SECTION 93-1 Registration and license required.

- A. Retained in its entirety all parts and subparts.
- (8) The names of at least two reliable property owners of the County of Camden, New Jersey, who will certify as to the applicant's good character and business responsibility or, in lieu of the names of such references, such other available evidence as to the good character and business responsibility of the applicant as will enable an investigator to properly evaluate such character and business responsibility.

ARTICLE II. ARTICLE I. SECTION 93-4 Fees.

Every peddler or solicitor shall deposit with the Borough Clerk a license fee in the sum of One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) per permit, plus a fee of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) to cover the cost of producing a photo ID badge. Thereafter, the peddler or solicitor shall be issued an identification badge or button for use while peddling or soliciting in the Borough of Barrington. All permits shall be valid for a period of six months and shall expire six months after the date issued.

ARTICLE III. ARTICLE I. SECTION 93-5 Times for soliciting.

- A. No one shall be permitted to peddle or solicit before 9:00 a.m. on any weekday.
- B. No one shall be permitted to peddle or solicit after 9:00 p.m. on any weekday.
- C. No one shall be permitted to peddle or solicit on any Sunday.

ARTICLE IV. ARTICLE I. SECTION 93-6 Establishment, Display and Distribution of a "Do Not Knock Registry"

- A. The Police Clerk shall prepare a list of addresses of those premises where the owner and/or occupant has notified the Police Clerk that peddling, soliciting, canvassing, hawking and door-to-door sales enterprising as set forth in this Chapter are not permitted on the premises (hereinafter referred to as the "Do Not Knock Registry"). Notification shall be by completion of a form available at the Police Department office during normal business hours.
- B. Any owner and/or occupant who has requested enlistment on the Do Not Knock Registry, pursuant to this Chapter herein, shall be able to obtain from the Police Department office a

sticker for display at his/her/its premises indicating enlistment on the Do Not Knock Registry.

- C. Owners and/or occupants who are placed on the Do Not Knock Registry at their request, shall remain on the Do Not Knock Registry until such time as they advise the Police Clerk in writing that they wish to be removed from the list.
- D. The Police Clerk shall distribute the current Do Not Knock Registry to a licensee under this Chapter at the time of issuance of a license to peddle, solicit, canvas, hawk or otherwise door-to-door sell pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter. The Do Not Knock Registry provided to licensees shall only include the physical address of the enlisted premises. The licensee shall not peddle, solicit, canvas, hawk or conduct door-to-door sales at any premises identified on the then current Do Not Knock Registry.

ARTICLE V.

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.

ARTICLE VI.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1099

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY ADDING CHAPTER 96, PUBLIC HEALTH NUISANCE CODE, IN THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey, that Chapter 96, Public Health Nuisance Code, is added to the Code of the Borough of Barrington, as follows:

ARTICLE I. SECTION 96-1

Adoption of standards by reference.

- A. A code defining and prohibiting certain matters, things, conditions or acts and each of them as a nuisance; prohibiting certain noises or sounds; requiring the proper heating of apartments; prohibiting the lease or rental of certain buildings; prohibiting spitting in or upon public buildings, conveyances or sidewalks; authorizing the inspection of premises by an enforcing official; providing for the removal or abatement of certain nuisances and recovery of expenses incurred by the Board of Health in removing or abating such nuisances; and prescribing penalties for violations is hereby established pursuant to Chapter 188 of the Laws of 1950 (N.J.S.A. 26:3-69.1 to 26:3-69.6). A copy of said code is annexed hereto and made a part hereof without the inclusion of the text thereof herein.
- B. The said code established and adopted by this chapter is described and commonly known as the "Public Health Nuisance Code of New Jersey (1953)."

ARTICLE II. SECTION 96-2

Copies of code on file.

Three (3) copies of the said Public Health Nuisance Code of New Jersey (1953) have been placed on file in the office of the Secretary of this local Board of Health upon the introduction of this chapter and will remain on file there for the use and examination of the public.

ARTICLE III. SECTION 96-3

Violations; penalties

Any person, firm or corporation who or which shall violate any of the provisions of this Chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable for penalties or any combination thereof as set forth in Chapter 1-15 of the Code of the Borough of Barrington, in the discretion of the Judge of the Municipal Court before whom such violation is heard and conviction made. Each day that a violation occurs shall be deemed a separate and distinct violation, subject to the penalty provisions of this Chapter.

ARTICLE IV.

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.
