- **B.** Application. Application shall be made to the Fire Official for the uses and/or activities set forth in 59-8A. No application for a permit shall be acted upon unless such application is submitted ten (10) working days prior to an inspection.
- C. Code Status Reports. The fee for a Fire Code Status Report shall be \$90.00
- **D.** Fire Reports. (When not, an Opra requested report) the Cost for a detailed fire investigation summary report will be as follows:

Fire cause and origin reports \$130.00 (Fire report only)
Fire scene photos \$60.00 (Fire photos only)
Total for both report and photos \$190.00

ARTICLE II. SECTION 59-9 Inspection of non-life hazard uses.

A. The local enforcing agency established by 59-2 shall carry out non-life-hazard inspection

uses and/or activities. Failure to register with this Office within 30 days of receipt of bill will result in your annual fee being doubled. WHEREAS, Senator Vin Gopal has sponsored legislation (Sl331), that has been approved by the Senate and General Assembly, to extend the deduction to veterans and their widowed spouses in CCRCs;

WHEREAS, the extension of the deduction, because it requires an amendment to the State Constitution, must be approved by the voters at the ballot in November before it will become valid and effective; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington now desire to memorialize their support of the referendum on the ballot in November, and to urge the voters of this State to vote in favor of the property tax deduction for veterans and widowed spouses of veterans who reside in CCRCs;
