AUTHORIZING THE TAX COLLECTOR TO PROCESS THIRD QUARTER "ESTIMATED" TAX BILLS, DUE AUGUST 1, 2020

WHEREAS, in light of the disruption caused by the coronavirus outbreak, the State delayed the adoption of the State Fiscal Year 2021 Budget to September 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Local Government Services (DLGS) cannot certify State Aid allocations to municipal budgets until State Aid Appropriations are known; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Taxation cannot certify taxes until long after the June 30, 2020 deadline to process third quarter tax bills due August 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, without a 2020 Certified Tax Rate, the Tax Collector cannot process the final 2020 Tax Levy; and

WHEREAS, the DLGS "strongly recommends" under Local Finance Notice 2020-07 "that municipalities prepare to issue estimated property tax bills for 2020;" and

WHEREAS, the Tax Collector, in consultation with the Chief Financial Officer, computed and certified an estimated Tax Levy necessary to bill third quarter taxes due August 1, 2020

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington in the County of Camden and State of New Jersey on this 9th day of June, 2020 that the Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to process estimated tax bills for the third quarterly installment of 2020 taxes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, the third quarterly installment of 2020 taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of August 10, 2020 or the twenty-fifth (25) calendar day after the date the estimated tax bills were mailed. The estimated tax bills shall contain a notice specifying the date on which interest may begin to accrue.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Barrington also has in its employ a certain individual known as Denise Moules, who is a Certified Municipal Finance Officer in the State of New Jersey pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:9-140-10 and the regulations promulgated thereunder who has been appointed by Barrington as the Chief Financial Officer for the Borough of Barrington, and is available to provide the needed services; and

WHEREAS, representatives of each Borough have come to agreement on mutually beneficial arrangements for Barrington to provide the services of Kristy Emmett as Merchantville's Tax Collector on a part-time basis for the sum of \$25,500, and for Barrington to provide the services of Denise Moules as Merchantville's CFO on a part time basis for the sum of \$45,000.00, subject to adjustments as provided during the term of the agreements, pursuant to detailed written documents, copies of which are attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act (N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq) permits two local units to enter into a contract for any service which any party to the agreement is empowered to render within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined that it is in the best interests of the Borough to enter into Shared Services agreements with the Borough of Merchantville to provide such services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Mayor and Council of the Borough of Barrington as follows:

WHEREAS, the SMART Fund builds upon the \$150 billion set aside in the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act to help state and local governments. It eliminates the current 500,000 population threshold allowing every state, county, municipality, US territory and the District of Columbia to qualify for direct federal assistance, regardless of its size; and

WHEREAS, the SMART Fund targets funding to areas of greatest need based upon infection rates and revenue losses and overturns the US Treasury's erroneous guidance that placed undue restrictions on how state and local governments could use the CARES stabilization funding; and

WHEREAS, specifically, the SMART Fund would provide \$500 billion to state, local and tribal governments in order to avoid mass layoffs, steep tax hikes and a breakdown of essential services. After a \$16 billion set-aside for Native American tribal governments, the remaining funding would be allocated to states through three equally divided sources of funding:

1. One-third directly to every state, county and local government based on population distributed based on the formula outlined below;
2. One-third to states based on the rate of infection;
3. One-third to states based on the state's revenue loss;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden and State of New Jersey, that it expresses its support for the passage of the Federal SMART Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be submitted to Senator Robert Menendez, Senator Cory Booker and Congressman Donald Norcross.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF UP TO \$1,966,000 OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, USDA SERIES 2020A, OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON; MAKING CERTAIN COVENANTS TO MAINTAIN THE EXEMPTION OF THE INTEREST ON SAID BONDS FROM FEDERAL INCOME TAXATION; AND AUTHORIZING SUCH FURTHER ACTIONS AND MAKING SUCH DETERMINATIONS AS MAY BE NECESSARY OR APPROPRIATE TO EFFECTUATE THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF THE BONDS

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Bond Law, Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), the Borough Council ("Council") of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, New Jersey ("Borough"), has, pursuant to bond ordinance 2012-986 ("Bond Ordinance"), duly and finally adopted and published in accordance with the requirements of Local Bond Law, authorized the issuance of general obligations bonds or bond anticipation notes of the Borough to finance the costs of the capital improvements set forth in and authorized by the Bond Ordinance (collectively the "Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to: (i) permanently finance the costs of the Improvements by the issuance and sale of its general obligation bonds; and (ii) pay the costs associated with the issuance and sale of its general obligation bonds (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Local Bond Law and the Bond Ordinance, it is the intent of the Council to hereby authorize, approve and direct the issuance and sale of such bonds, to ratify and confirm certain action heretofore by and on behalf of the Borough and to make certain related determination and authorizations in connection with such issuance and sale.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL BOND LAW (NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS OF ALL THE MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law and the Bond Ordinance, the issuance and sale of and award of the negotiable general obligation bonds of the Borough, to be designated substantially "Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, New Jersey, General Obligation Bonds, USDA Series 2020A" ("Bonds"), in an aggregate principal amount of up to \$1,966,000 for the Project, is hereby authorized and approved.

Section 2. The Bonds shall contain such provisions and be in the form prescribed and permitted by the Local Bond Law, as Bond Counsel may advise and as the Borough and Purchaser (hereinafter defined) shall approve. The Bonds shall be initially issued in certificated form registered in the name of the Purchaser. The Bonds shall be executed by the manual signature of the Mayor and Chief Financial Officer, attested by the manual signature of the Borough Clerk, and shall bear the corporate seal of the Borough thereon.

Section 3. The Bonds are hereby awarded to the United States of America ("Purchaser") at the price of \$1,966,000 and at an interest rate not to exceed 2.000% per annum. The Bonds, which will be initially issued in the form of one bond, shall be dated the date of closing. The first

payment date for the Bonds shall be six months from the date of closing and semi-annually thereafter, until the Bonds are paid in full. The term of the Bonds is equal to or less than the period of usefulness of the Project being financed through the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 4. The full faith and credit of the Borough are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and, to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all taxable real property within the Borough without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

Section 5. The Borough hereby covenants that it will not make any use of the proceeds of the Bonds or do or suffer any other action that would cause: (i) the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Income Tax Regulations promulgated thereunder; (ii) the interest on the Bonds to be included in the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes; or (iii) the interest on the Bonds to be treated as an item of tax preference under Section 57(a)(5) of the Code.

Section 6. The Borough hereby covenants as follows: (i) it shall timely file with the Internal Revenue Service, such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and (ii) it shall take no action that would cause the Bonds to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.

Section 7. The Borough expects that the Bonds will be treated as satisfying the requirements to rebate to the United States of arbitrage profits with respect to the proceeds of the Bonds by satisfying the requirements for exemption from rebate provided for in Section 148(f)(4)(C) of the Code ("Small Issuer Exception") since: (i) the Borough is a governmental unit of the State of New Jersey and is empowered to exercise general taxing powers with respect to all non-exempt real property within the Borough; (ii) none of the proceeds of the Bonds will be loaned to nongovernmental entities; (iii) no portion of the payment of debt service on the Bonds are secured by property owned by or payments (other than taxes of general applicability) to be made by nongovernmental units; (iv) all of the net proceeds of the Bonds are being used to pay the costs of local government activities of the Borough; (v) the Borough does not expect that the aggregate face amount of tax-exempt bonds (other than private-activity bonds described in Section 141 of the Code and certain current refunding bonds described in 148(f)(4)(C) of the Code) issued during the calendar year 2020 will exceed \$5,000,000; (vi) there are no entities that may issue bonds on behalf of the Borough; and (vii) none of the proceeds of the Bonds will be loaned by the Borough to a governmental unit with general taxing powers.

Section 8. If the Bonds fail to qualify for the Small Issuer Exception to arbitrage rebate, the Borough will pay, or cause to be paid, to the United States Treasury in the manner and at the time prescribed in Regulations §§1.148-1 through 1.148-11, 1.149(b)-1, 1.149(d)-1, 1.149(g)-1, 1.150-1 and 1.150-2, as such regulations and statutory provisions may be modified insofar as they apply to the Bonds, an amount equal to the rebatable arbitrage earned by investing proceeds of the Bonds.

Section 9. The Borough hereby designates the Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" as defined in and for the purposes of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code. For purposes of this designation, the Borough hereby represents that the amount of tax-exempt obligations to be issued by it during the period from January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020, and the amount of obligations designated as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" by it, will not exceed \$10,000,000 when added to the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds.

For purposes of this Section 9, the following obligations are not taken into account in determining the aggregate principal amount of tax-exempt obligations issued by the Borough: (i) a private activity bond, as defined in Section 141 of the Code (other than a qualified 501(c)(3) bond, as defined in Section 145 of the Code); and (ii) any obligation issued to refund any other tax-exempt obligation (other than to advance refund within the meaning of Section 149(d)(5) of the Code) as provided in Section 265(b)(3)(c).

Section 10. All actions heretofore taken and documents prepared or executed by or on behalf of the Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Borough Clerk, Deputy Borough Clerk, other Borough officials or by the Borough's professional advisors, in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds and construction of the Project, are hereby ratified, confirmed, approved and adopted.

Section 11. All actions heretofore taken and documents prepared or executed by or on behalf of the Borough by the Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Borough Clerk, Deputy Borough Clerk, other Borough officials or by the Borough's professional advisors, in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds or the Project are hereby ratified, confirmed, approved and adopted.

Section 12. The Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Borough Clerk and Deputy Borough Clerk are each hereby authorized to determine all matters and execute all documents and instruments in connection with the Bonds or the Project not determined or otherwise directed to be executed by the Local Bond Law, the Bond Ordinance, or by this or any subsequent resolution, and the signature of the Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk on such documents or instruments shall be conclusive as to such determinations.

Section 13. All resolutions, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith or with the Authorizing Resolution, are hereby rescinded and repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency.

Section 14. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption this 9th day of June, 2020.

(herein after called Association) to raise a portion of the cost of such undertaking by issuance of its bonds in the principal amount of

pursuant to the provisions of THE LOCAL BOND LAW, CHAPTER 169 OF THE LAWS OF 1960 OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY
AND BOND ORDINANCE 2012-986, DULY ADOPTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL AND PUBLISHED IN ACCORDANCE
WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF LOCAL BOND LAW; and;**WHEREAS**, the Association intends to obtain assistance from the United States Department of Agriculture, (herein called the Government) acting under the provisions of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act (7 U.S.C. 1921 et seq.) in the planning, financing, and supervision of such undertaking and the purchasing of bonds lawfully issued, in the event that no other acceptable purchaser for such bonds is found by the Association:**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the premises the Association hereby resolves:

1. To have prepared on its behalf and to adopt an ordinance or resolution for the issuance of its bonds containing such items and in such forms as are required by State statutes and as are agreeable and acceptable to the Government.
2. To refinance the unpaid balance, in whole or in part, of its bonds upon the request of the Government if at any time it shall appear to the Government that the Association is able to refinance its bonds by obtaining a loan for such purposes from responsible cooperative or private sources at reasonable rates and terms for loans for similar purposes and periods of time as required by section 333(c) of said Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act (7 U.S.C. 1983(c)).
3. To provide for, execute, and comply with Form RD 400-4, "Assurance Agreement," and Form RD 400-1, "Equal Opportunity Agreement," including an "Equal Opportunity Clause," which clause is to be incorporated in, or attached as a rider to, each construction contract and subcontract involving in excess of \$10,000.
4. To indemnify the Government for any payments made or losses suffered by the Government on behalf of the Association. Such indemnification shall be payable from the same source of funds pledged to pay the bonds or any other legally permissible source.
5. That upon default in the payments of any principal and accrued interest on the bonds or in the performance of any covenant or agreement contained herein or in the instruments incident to making or insuring the loan, the Government at its option may (a) declare the entire principal amount then outstanding and accrued interest immediately due and payable, (b) for the account of the Association (payable from the source of funds pledged to pay the bonds or any other legally permissible source), incur and pay reasonable expenses for repair, maintenance, and operation of the facility and such other reasonable expenses as may be necessary to cure the cause of default, and/or (c) take possession of the facility, repair, maintain, and operate or rent it. 6. Not to sell, transfer, lease, or otherwise encumber the facility or any portion thereof, or interest therein, or permit others to do so, without the prior written consent of the Government.
7. Not to defease the bonds, or to borrow money, enter into any contractor agreement, or otherwise incur any liabilities for any purpose in connection with the facility (exclusive of normal maintenance) without the prior written consent of the Government if such undertaking would involve the source of funds pledged to pay the bonds.
8. To place the proceeds of the bonds on deposit in an account and in a manner approved by the Government. Funds may be deposited in institutions insured by the State or Federal Government or invested in readily marketable securities backed by the full faith and credit of the United States. Any income from these accounts will be considered as revenues of the system.
9. To comply with all applicable State and Federal laws and regulations and to continually operate and maintain the facility in good condition.
10. To provide for the receipt of adequate revenues to meet the requirements of debt service, operation and maintenance, and the establishment of adequate reserves. Revenue accumulated over and above that needed to pay operating and maintenance, debt service and reserves may only be retained or used to make prepayments on the loan. Revenue cannot be used to pay any expenses which are not directly incurred for the facility financed by USDA. No free service or use of the facility will be permitted.

That if the Government requires that a reserve account be established, disbursements from that account(s) may be used when necessary for payments due on the bond if sufficient funds are not otherwise available and prior approval of the Government is obtained. Also, with the prior written approval of the Government, funds may be withdrawn and used for such things as emergency maintenance, extensions to facilities and replacement of short lived assets.

Upon failure to provide services which are feasible and legal, such person shall have a direct right of action against the Association or public body.
 16. To comply with the measures identified in the Government's environmental impact analysis for this facility for the purpose of avoiding or reducing the adverse environmental impacts of the facility's construction or operation.
 17. To accept a grant in an amount not to exceed \$0
- under the terms offered by the Government; that the MAYOR, ADMINISTRATOR AND CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER
and BOROUGH CLERK of the Association are hereby authorized and empowered to take all action necessary or appropriate in the execution of all written instruments as may be required in regard to or as evidence of such grant; and to operate the facility under the terms offered in said grant agreement(s).

The provisions hereof and the provisions of all instruments incident to the making or the insuring of the loan, unless otherwise specifically provided by the terms of such instrument, shall be binding upon the Association as long as the bonds are held or insured by the Government or assignee. The provisions of sections 6 through 17 hereof may be provided for in more specific detail in the bond resolution or ordinance; to the extent that the provisions contained in such bond resolution or ordinance should be found to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof, these provisions shall be construed as controlling between the Association and the Government or assignee.
