

ORDINANCE NO. 1125

BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE COMPLETION OF VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS CAPITAL EQUIPMENT IN AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$390,000 THEREFOR; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY, IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF UP TO \$370,500, MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS AND COVENANTS; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE FOREGOING

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, constituting Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

Section 1. The purposes described in Section 7 hereof are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, New Jersey ("Borough").

Section 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- (a) the estimated amount to be raised by the Borough from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$390,000;
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$370,500; and
- (c) a down payment in the amount of \$19,500 for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is currently available in accordance with the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11.

Section 3. The sum of \$370,500, to be raised by the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, together with the sum of \$19,500, which amount represents the required down payment, are hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").

Section 4. The issuance of negotiable bonds of the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$370,500 to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law.

Section 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes described in Section 7 hereof, the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$370,500 is hereby authorized. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell all or part of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their date to delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date

when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this Bond Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, accounting, engineering, legal fees and other items as provided in Section 20 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20, shall not exceed the sum of \$80,000.

Section 7. The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which said obligations are to be issued; the estimated costs of each said purpose; the amount of down payment for each said purpose; the amount of available grants; the maximum amount of obligations to be issued for said purpose and the period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law are as follows:

Section 8. Grants or other monies received from any governmental entity, if any, will be applied to the payment of, or repayment of obligations issued to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 above.

Section 9. The average period of useful life of the purposes for the financing of which the Bond Ordinance authorizes the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized for such several purposes, is not less than 11.26 years.

Section 10. The supplemental debt statement provided for in Section 10 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10, was duly filed in the office of the Clerk prior to the passage of this Bond Ordinance on first reading and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43, is increased by this Bond Ordinance by \$370,500 and that the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 11. The full faith and credit of the Borough are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance, and to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

Section 12. The Capital Budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk and available for inspection.

Section 13. The Borough hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance pursuant to Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(e), promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), for "original expenditures", as defined in Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(c)(2), made by the Borough prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

Section 14. The Borough hereby covenants as follows:

(a) it shall take all actions necessary to ensure that the interest paid on the bonds or bond anticipation notes is exempt from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes, and will not become a specific item of tax preference pursuant to Section 57(a)(5) of the Code;

(b) it will not make any use of the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes or do or suffer any other action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder;

(c) it shall calculate or cause to be calculated and pay, when due, the rebatable arbitrage with respect to the "gross proceeds" (as such term is used in Section 148(f) of the Code) of the bonds or bond anticipation notes;

(d) it shall timely file with the Internal Revenue Service, such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and

(e) it shall take no action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.

Section 15. The improvements authorized hereby are not current expenses and are improvements that the Borough may lawfully make. No part of the cost of the improvements authorized hereby has been or shall be specially assessed on any property specially benefited thereby.

Section 16. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency.

Section 17. In accordance with the Local Bond Law, this Bond Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

**ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND
STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 48, ANIMALS, IN THE CODE OF THE
BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey, that Chapter 48, Animals, in the Code of the Borough of Barrington is hereby amended as follows:

ARTICLE I. ARTICLE I. SECTION 48-2.1 Late fee.

Any person who violates Chapter 48, Section 48-1, General Provisions by not licensing or renewing the license of any dog or cat by November 30 of each year, shall be subject to a late fee of \$10.00. Said fee shall be charged per pet.

ARTICLE II. ARTICLE V. SECTION 48-17 Licensing requirements;fees.

H. Fees, renewal and expiration date of license.

(1) The person applying for the annual license and registration tag shall pay the fee fixed or authorized. All licenses purchased in 2020 shall expire September 30, 2021, Thereafter, the license term for all pet licenses shall be on an October 1 to September 30 license period.

ARTICLE III. ARTIVLE V. SECCTION 48-18 Violations and penalties; late fee.

B. Any person who does not secure or renew the required license in accordance with the provisions herein by November 30 of each year shall be assessed a late fee of \$10.00 in addition to the license fee. Said late fee shall be assessed per pet.

ARTICLE IV.

 All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.

ARTICLE V.

 This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1128

**ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN,
AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 49, BRUSH GRASS AND WEEDS
AND CHAPTER 95, PROPERTY MAINTENANCE, OF THE BOROUGH CODE**

WHEREAS, it has been determined the bamboo plant is an invasive plant and often difficult to control, and can and has caused significant damage and nuisances to properties and residents in the Borough of Barrington ("Borough"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2.13, the Borough is authorized to enact ordinances requiring the destruction and removal of brush, weeds, stumps, roots and obnoxious growth where necessary to preserve the public health, safety and general welfare; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2, the Borough is authorized to enact ordinances for the protection of person and property and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has deemed it in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to amend Chapter 49 and Chapter 95 of the Borough Code to regulate the growth of bamboo;

NOW THEREFORE, be it Ordained by the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 49, Brush Grass and Weeds, and Chapter 95, Property Maintenance, of the Code of the Borough of Barrington are hereby amended, revised and supplemented by adding a new Article to each chapter which shall provide as follows:

ARTICLE XX. BAMBOO REGULATIONS

§ 49-X AND 95-X. Bamboo Planting.

A. Purpose. The purpose of this subsection is to preserve and protect private and public property from the damaging spread of bamboo grasses, protect property and indigenous plant materials from the invasive spread of bamboo and to maintain the general welfare of the residents of the Borough of Barrington.

B. Prohibition. No owner, tenant or occupant of a property, or person, corporation or other entity, shall plant, install or cause or permit the planting or installation of plant species commonly known as "bamboo-running" upon any property located within the Borough of Barrington except as provided for and in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

C. Duty to confine. In the event any species commonly known as "bamboo-running" is located upon any property within the Borough of Mount, the owner or occupant of said property shall confine such species to prevent the encroachment, spread, invasion or intrusion of same onto any other private or public property or public right of way by way of a rhizome (underground stem) barrier, which shall (1) be constructed of concrete, metal or plastic, such as high-density polypropylene, 40 mil or heavier, glued or taped at

junctions, or clamped with stainless-steel clamps; (2) be at least three feet deep and project at least one inch above ground level; and (3) be slanted outward at the top so that when the stems hit the barrier they will bend upwards. Rhizomes that arch or grow over the top of the barrier shall be cut off to prevent the spreading thereof. Failure to properly confine such bamboo in accordance with this section shall require its complete removal.

D. Removal. In the event it is determined that there is an encroachment or invasion on any adjoining private or public property or public right of way, the Borough shall notice the bamboo property owner in writing that the bamboo has invaded other private or public property or public right of way and demand the removal of the bamboo from such other private or public property or public right of way and the confinement against future encroachment or the total removal of the bamboo from the owner's property. Notice shall be provided by certified, return receipt requested mail and regular mail. If the bamboo property owner does not remove the bamboo from such other private or public property or public right of way within 45 days of the date of notice, the Code Enforcement Officer shall cause a citation to be issued with a penalty up to \$100.00 for each day the violation continues, enforceable through the Municipal Court of the Borough of Barrington, as well as civil proceedings for injunctive or civil relief. Nothing herein shall be interpreted as limiting the rights of a private property owner to seek civil relief through a Court of proper jurisdiction, nor the institution of civil proceedings against the proper parties. When an encroachment is upon public property or public right of way, the Borough of Barrington, at its discretion, may remove or contract for the removal of such bamboo from the Borough property or public right of way, the cost of which shall be the responsibility of the bamboo property owner and shall be assessed as a lien against the property on which the bamboo growth originated. The cost of removal from the Borough owned property and or public right of way shall include the installation of an appropriate barrier to prevent future bamboo invasion.

E. Violations and penalties. Except as otherwise provided in subsection D above, any person, firm, corporation or other entity violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not less than \$500.00 but not more than \$2,000.00 or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both, in the discretion of the Judge before whom such conviction shall be entered.

SECTION 2: Except as set forth in Section 1 above, the balance of Chapter 49 and Chapter 95 shall not be effected by this Ordinance.

SECTION 3: All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4: If the provisions of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance shall be judged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such order of judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.
