ORDINANCE NO. 1139

ARTICLE I.

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY REVISING AND REPLACING CHAPTER 116, TREES, IN THE BOROUGH CODE

Curbside Trees

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey that Chapter 116, Trees, is hereby revised and replaced in the Code of the Borough of Barrington, as follows:

116-1 Establishment 116-2. Power 116-3. Costs and Improvements 116-4. Curbside tree planting, official species. 116-5. Tree placement; spacing. 116-6. Duties. 116-7. Tree topping. Pruning; corner clearance. 116-8. 116-9. Certified tree expert. 116-10. Work by property owners. Items affixed to curbline streets; prohibition. 116-11. 116-12. Penalty for violation of ordinance; enforcement. Hazardous conditions. 116-13.

Section 116.1. Establishment.

The regulation of planting, removing and control, along with the maintenance of shade trees and ornamental trees and shrubbery along the curbside of streets, highways, public places, parks and parkways, other than county parks and parkways, withing the Borough of Barrington, shall be managed and under the control of the Governing Body or their designee(s).

Section 116.2. Power.

The Director of Public Works shall possess and be vested with the following powers:

- A. To exercise full and exclusive control over the regulation, planting, removal and maintaining of the shade and ornamental trees now located, or which may hereafter be planted in the public right-of-way. Any planting on private property will be with the consent of the homeowner.
- B. The Public Works Department, under the direction of the Superintendent, will remove or require the removal of any trees, or part thereof, dangerous to public safety in the public right-of-way. Guidelines determining cause for removal will be established.
- C. To develop a program of tree planting and overall beautification in areas along the public right-of-way; to develop a plan for the care and control of existing trees; to select sites where other trees can be removed; and supervise planting of new trees in the town where

they are needed. Any planting on private property will be with the consent of the homeowner.

D. To provide a procedure for removing or trimming existing trees where necessary because the tree is either dead, diseased or injured or interfering with utility overhead wires in the public right-of-way.

Section 116.3. Costs and Improvements.

The costs of any work undertaken pursuant to this article shall be subject to prior approval by Mayor and Council, either by annual budget allotment or by special appropriation as warranted.

Section 116.4. Curbside tree planting; official species.

A. The following list constitutes the official curbside tree species to be considered for planting in the public right-of-way:

Shade Trees

Hornbeam

Ginkgo-male

Maple

Oak

Elm

Linden

Sweet Gum

Tulip Tree

Zelkova

Smaller Species

Japanese Lilac

Ornamental pear (Chanticleer and Callery)

Section 116-5. Tree placement; spacing.

No tree may be planted closer than:

- A. Ten feet from a utility pole.
- B. Seven feet from a fire hydrant.
- C. Twenty-five feet from an existing tree.
- D. Twenty-five feet from a street intersection.
- E. Seven feet from a water, sewer, gas or other underground utility.
- F. Seven feet from the widest part of a driveway entrance.

Section 116-6. Duties.

A. The Superintendent of Public Works, in consultation with the Borough Clerk, shall have the

right to plant, prune, maintain and remove trees, plants and shrubs within the curbside lines of all streets, avenues, lanes and public grounds as may be necessary to ensure public safety or to preserve or enhance the symmetry and beauty of such public grounds.

B. The Public Works department, under the direction of the Superintendent, may remove, or cause or order to be removed, any tree or part thereof which is in any unsafe condition or which by reason of its nature is injurious to sewer lines, utility or water lines or other public improvements, or is affected with any injurious microbe or pest in the public right-of-way.

Section 116-7. Pruning; corner clearance.

The Public Works Department, under the direction of the Superintendent, shall have the right to prune any tree or shrub on private property when it interferes with the proper spread of light or interferes with visibility of any traffic control device or sign.

116-8. Certified tree expert.

In order to assess the health of any tree within the right-of-way in the Borough of Barrington, a certified tree expert will be requested to examine said tree that is in the public right-of-way.

116-9. Work by property owners.

Property owners who wish to prune or remove a curbside tree abutting their property within the right-of-way must obtain approval from the Superintendent of Public Works prior to commencement of the work.

116-10. Items affixed to curbline streets; prohibition.

It is unlawful to attach in any manner chains or signs of any sort to any curbside tree or to place nails of any type into any curbside tree, except that which the Police Department deems for emergency purposes.

116-11. Penalty for violation of ordinance, enforcement.

Trees will be protected from said vandalism and other offenses by reporting the matter to the Police Department.

116-12. Hazardous conditions.

The Public Works Superintendent will have the authority to act on any condition hazardous to public safety with approval from the Public Works Director.

ARTICLE II.

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith. If any section, subsection, paragraphs, sentence, clause, phrase or word contained in this code shall be declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this code which shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, and State of New Jersey that Chapter 59, Fire Prevention, is hereby amended in the Code of the Borough of Barrington, as follows:

ARTICLE I. SECTION 59-1 Local Enforcement.

Pursuant to the New Jersey Uniform Fire Safety Act,^[1] the New Jersey Uniform Fire Code shall be locally enforced in the municipalities participating in the Regional Fire Prevention Alliance (Boroughs of Barrington, Hi-Nella, Lawnside, Mount Ephraim and Oaklyn).

ARTICLE III. SECTION 59-9 Inspection of non-life hazard uses.

- **B.** Smoke and carbon monoxide alarm inspections.
 - (1) Smoke and carbon monoxide alarm inspections, to be conducted on all one- and two-family residential dwellings for resale being sold within our local L.E.A. shall be charged as follows:

(a)	Request received 14+ business days prior	\$56.00
(b)	Request received 8 to 13 business days prior	\$64.00
(c)	Request received 4 to 7 business days prior	\$96.00
(d)	Request received 3 business days or less prior	\$161.00

- (2) The above fee entitles the applicant to one (1) inspection and one (1) re-inspection. A third (3rd) visit requires a new application and new fee.
- (3) A certificate is valid for a period of six months from the date of issuance.

ARTICLE IV.

SECTION 59-13

Violations and penalties.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable as provided in the New Jersey Uniform Fire Safety Act.

ARTICLE V.

All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.

ARTICLE VI.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.

BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE COMPLETION OF VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS CAPITAL EQUIPMENT IN AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$2,921,350 THEREFOR; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY, IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF UP TO \$2,775,283, MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS AND COVENANTS; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE FOREGOING

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, constituting Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The purposes described in Section 7 hereof are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, New Jersey ("Borough").

Section 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- the estimated amount to be raised by the Borough from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$2,921,350;
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$2,775,283; and
- (c) a down payment in the amount of \$146,067 for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is currently available in accordance with the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11.

Section 3. The sum of \$2,775,283, to be raised by the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, together with the sum of \$146,067, which amount represents the required down payment, are hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").

Section 4. The issuance of negotiable bonds of the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$2,775,283 to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law.

Section 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes described in Section 7 hereof, the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$2,775,283 is hereby authorized. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell all or part of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase

price plus accrued interest from their date to delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this Bond Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

<u>Section 6.</u> The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, accounting, engineering, legal fees and other items as provided in Section 20 of the Local Bond Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:2-20, shall not exceed the sum of \$600,000.

<u>Section 7.</u> The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which said obligations are to be issued; the estimated costs of each said purpose; the amount of down payment for each said purpose; the amount of available grants; the maximum amount of obligations to be issued for said purpose and the period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law are as follows:

<u>Section 8.</u> Grants or other monies received from any governmental entity, if any, will be applied to the payment of, or repayment of obligations issued to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 above.

<u>Section 9.</u> The average period of useful life of the purposes for the financing of which the Bond Ordinance authorizes the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized for such several purposes, is not less than 11.42 years.

Section 10. The supplemental debt statement provided for in Section 10 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10, was duly filed in the office of the Clerk prior to the passage of this Bond Ordinance on first reading and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43, is increased by this Bond Ordinance by \$2,775,283 and that the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

<u>Section 11.</u> The full faith and credit of the Borough are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance, and to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the Borough shall levy <u>ad valorem</u> taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

<u>Section 12.</u> The Capital Budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk and available for inspection.

<u>Section 13.</u> The Borough hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance pursuant to Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(e), promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), for "original expenditures", as defined in Income Tax Regulation

Section 1.150-2(c)(2), made by the Borough prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

Section 14. The Borough hereby covenants as follows:

- (a) it shall take all actions necessary to ensure that the interest paid on the bonds or bond anticipation notes is exempt from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes, and will not become a specific item of tax preference pursuant to Section 57(a)(5) of the Code;
- (b) it will not make any use of the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes or do or suffer any other action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder;
- (c) it shall calculate or cause to be calculated and pay, when due, the rebatable arbitrage with respect to the "gross proceeds" (as such term is used in Section 148(f) of the Code) of the bonds or bond anticipation notes;
- (d) it shall timely file with the Internal Revenue Service, such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and
- (e) it shall take no action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.
- <u>Section 15.</u> The improvements authorized hereby are not current expenses and are improvements that the Borough may lawfully make. No part of the cost of the improvements authorized hereby has been or shall be specially assessed on any property specially benefited thereby.
- **Section 16.** All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency.
- **Section 17.** In accordance with the Local Bond Law, this Bond Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

<u>Section 1.</u> The Borough of Barrington, County of Camden, New Jersey ("Borough"), is hereby authorized to refund up to all of its outstanding callable General Obligation Bonds, Series 2010, dated June 7, 2010, in the aggregate principal amount of \$2,205,000, and maturing as follows (collectively, the "2010 Callable Bonds"):

To effectuate the refunding of up to all of the Callable Bonds, negotiable general obligation refunding bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in one or more series, on a tax-exempt or taxable basis, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$5,600,000 ("Refunding Bonds"), pursuant to the Local Bond Law. The exact principal amount of Refunding Bonds to be issued and terms thereof (including whether to issue such Refunding Bonds on a tax-exempt or taxable basis) shall be determined pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Council by not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof.
