## To Our Friends and Neighbors

Well Spring is finally here and Summer is right around the corner—and we have a lot of fun events coming up. Barrington Day is May 18 at the Girls' Softball fields, the Memorial Day service is Monday, May 27 behind Borough Hall and the Independence Day parade and fireworks are scheduled for July 3 with July 5 as the rain date. Little League and Girls' Softball both held their opening day celebrations and their seasons

are underway. We wish them all a great season!

**Wish Upon a Star Playground**—we are so happy to see the playground being used by so many people. We have more improvements planned for this spring—a pavilion with picnic tables will be added and it will include a Little Free Library sponsored by Kiwanis of the Haddons. We added additional fencing around the perimeter of the playground upon request from many parents. This provides additional safety for young children. We are looking into how to provide restroom facilities and hope to have a solution soon.

**Redevelopment along White Horse Pike**—the Chick-Fil-A project continues to move forward as they have received all of their necessary approvals from NJDEP, NJDOT and the Barrington Planning Board. They hope to break ground by the end of this year or early next year. We are excited to have a Chick-Fil-A coming to town!

**Barrington Senior Citizen Bus**—The senior transport continues to run well and provide much needed transportation for our senior residents. The bus transports seniors during the day to needed stops--Borough Hall, Rite Aid, Shop Rite, Wal-Mart and the Post Office. We are looking at possibly expanding to provide additional services to our senior residents. Watch the borough website for more information. The bus currently runs Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 10:00am till 2:00pm.

**Barrington A.B.L.E. Group**—this group of volunteers is made-up of residents and church groups whose sole purpose is to assist their friends and neighbors in need. ## PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

**MAY 2019 NEWSLETTER ARTICLE - DPW**

**RECYCLING:** Businesses and Residents are required by State law, County and Local regulations to recycle. If you need a recycling container they are available at Borough Hall. Copies of trash and recycling collection schedule and regulations are also available at Borough Hall and on the Borough website at [www.barringtonboro.com](http://www.barringtonboro.com).

**VEGETATIVE WASTE PICK UP:**

Vegetative waste pick up is every Monday. Vegetative waste is grass clippings, stick-er balls, acorns, pinecones and other yard waste. Vegetative waste containers can also be obtained at Borough Hall for a nominal fee.

**SCRAP METAL:** The Borough provides a pick up on Fridays. Pick up by the Borough must be called into the DPW Office prior to Friday by calling 547-2486 ext.105. In an effort to curb scavengers, residents are asked to wait until the morning of pick up to put your items to the curb. You can also bring your scrap metal items to the DPW yard Monday thru Friday during normal business hours, 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., for disposal in our scrap metal dumpster or you can contact DPW ahead of time and we may be able to make arrangements for pick up prior to your regularly scheduled pick up day if our schedule and manpower allows.

**TIRES – RESIDENTIAL:** (2) tires per week per house hold, must be off the rims and can be put to curb for trash pickup. If tires are on the rims they will not be picked up.

**CONCRETE:** The Borough provides a pick up on Thursdays of small amounts. Pick up by the Borough must be called into the DPW office prior to Thursday by calling 547-2486 ext. 105. If you or a contractor are replacing your sidewalk and/or driveway or any other type of renovation work you will need to arrange for private disposal. Please remember concrete work requires a permit and sometimes a street opening permit if you're doing curb work. Please contact the Code Enforcement Office if you have any questions at 547-0706.

**BRUSH PICK UP:** The Borough provides a pick up on Mondays. Includes tree limbs and trimmings, brush with roots removed and stumps not more than twelve (12) inches in diameter. Brush, limbs and stumps should be no longer than 4ft. and stacked neatly curbside so not to protrude into the street or block the sidewalk. If stumps are more than 12" in diameter call DPW for special pick up, prior to Thursday. Any tree work done by a contractor is the responsibility of the contractor to dispose of debris. Place brush, limbs, stumps, curbside the night before collection but no earlier than 1:00 p.m. the day before to ensure pick up. Do not place brush, limbs, stumps in the street as this is a dangerous practice that may cause a liability problem. Brush, limbs, stumps placed on the park strip will not harm the grass. Due to heavy volume your pick up may not be completed on your scheduled pick up day--just leave at the curb and it will be picked up the following day.

**STUMP PICK UP:** The Borough provides a pick up on Thursdays of small amounts. Pick up by the Borough must be called into the DPW

Office prior to Thursday by calling 547-2486 ext. 105. If a resident has a contractor do any tree work the contractor is responsible for removing all debris.

**WOODEN FENCING AND RAILROAD**

**TIES:** The Borough provides a pickup of small amounts that should be no longer than 4' and limited to no more than 10 pieces per week. Pick up by the Borough will be on Fridays and is to be put curbside for trash pickup. If a contractor is doing the work the contractor is responsible for disposing of the debris.

**WASTE OIL:** Motor waste oil only may be brought to the Public Works Garage Monday thru Friday 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Please do not drop off after hours and leave at gate. Proof of residency required.

**TRASH AND RECYCLING:** Must be placed curbside by 6:00 a.m. on the day of collection but no sooner than 1:00 p.m. the day preceding collection. A copy of the trash and recycling regulations can be obtained at the Borough Hall or online at [www.barringtonboro.com](http://www.barringtonboro.com). Please remember to secure your trash properly. The Borough frequently receives complaints about unsecured trash littering the streets on windy days.

**TRASH: MOVE OUTS, ESTATES AND VACANT HOMES –** frequently these type of properties are problems because the Resident/Tenant, Family or Property Maintenance Company think that they can throw the house to the curb. This is not acceptable and is not in compliance with Borough ordinances and/or Regulations. The trash must be put in trash containers and/or contractor grade trash bags and all recyclables must be source separated and put out on the appropriate recycling day in compliance with Recycling Regulations. If the amount of trash is not a normal residential pick up, private disposal must be provided. If you see this type of problem in your neighborhood or if you have any questions please call the DPW at 856-547-2486.

**CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS:** Homeowner's are limited to five (5) containers per week. Please do not pile debris at the curb because it will not be picked up unless it is in a container. If you are remodeling yourself or using a private contractor and will be in excess of the amount described herein you will need to arrange for private disposal.

**SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING**

**COMMINGLE:** Includes empty unbroken food and/or beverage containers of clear, brown, and green glass: empty aluminum tin and/or bi-metal food and beverages containers, and empty plastic juice, soda, water, milk, and/or laundry detergent bottles with the number 1 and 2 symbols on the bottom. Do not include butter tubs, flower pots, anti-freeze or oil containers, laundry buckets, plastic bags, syringes, vinyl, 5 gallon pails. Make sure the acceptable containers are empty and rinsed out. Labels may be left on, but plastic caps should be discarded. **NO PLASTIC BAGS!**

**MIXED PAPERS:** Includes magazines, catalogs, envelopes, junk mail, school papers, work books, textbook (without covers) office paper, non-metallic wrapping paper and computer printout papers.

**NEWSPAPERS:** Includes all newspapers, including glossy inserts in the Sunday editions.

**CORRUGATED CARDBOARD:** Includes all types of unwaxed and uncoated corrugated cardboard and does not include food boxes or laundry detergent boxes. Corrugated is be flattened and bundled.

Single stream items can be placed all together in one yellow recycling container or you can continue to separate by placing commingle in recycling container, mixed paper and newspaper in a brown bag, corrugated cardboard by flattening and bundling. Recycling containers are available at Borough Hall. Place items curbside the night before collection but no earlier than 1:00 p.m. the day preceding collection to ensure that you're recycling will be picked up. Single stream recycling is collected by South Jersey Sanitation. If your recycling was not collected or there is a problem, please call South Jersey Sanitation at 609-561-0441 or call the Department of Public Works at 547-2486 ext. 105. Only the items mentioned above are acceptable. Please do not contaminate as this causes operational problems at the Recycling Facility.

Single Stream Recycling is not only the law, it is good for the environment and saves taxpayer funds. For 2018, recycling saved Barrington residents \$369,487.32 in trash disposal costs.

**ELECTRONICS RECYCLING:** Residents can bring their E-waste to the DPW yard for disposal. Hours for drop off are Monday thru Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The following items can be disposed of as E-waste:

ac adapters - microwave - all-in-one computers - motherboards, b, c, tweener and finger boards aluminum, brass, light iron and copper - motors audio and video equipment - pm3 players/ipods ballast (non-PCB's) - PC fans and power supplies car batteries - PC scrap and stereos (no wood) cash registers - PC's – desktop, laptops tablets, towers - cell phone and telephones - plastic - baled or loose - computer memory - police scanners and pagers - computer monitors – CRT or LCD - portables radios - computer periphery and parts - printers, copiers, scanners, modems, fax machine - e-readers - rechargeable batteries - game consoles - scales - gold clip ends - televisions - intact - handheld / table mounted scanners - toner and ink cartridges - hard drives - uninterrupted power supply - keyboards, mice and pc speakers - vacuums - laptop and cell phone batteries - vcr, dvd, blueray, laser disk and cd players - lead acid batteries - wire – all types - Metal – baled or loose - yokes - Household appliances not containing a compressor

As of January 1, 2011 it is mandatory to recycle covered electronic devices according to State law entitled "The Electronic Waste Management Act." The Borough of Barrington DPW began accepting electronics in 2010 and have recycled 128.64 tons since then as of the end of 2018. If residents have electronic items such as televisions that are too heavy or burdensome to drop off to DPW, please call and we will make special arrangements to pick up. Please be advised that any electronic items put to the curb for trash will not be picked up. For more information on elec-

**STREETLIGHTS:** If you should notice a light out, always on, flickering, broken or missing parts you can report to PSE&G customer service at 1-800-436-7734. You will need to obtain the pole # which is usually located at about eye level on a metal label attached to the wooden poles or at the base of the black metal streetscape poles. You will also need to provide street address and nearest cross street. If you prefer you can always call DPW to report and we will contact PSE&G.

**HAZARDOUS WASTE:** Items such as propane tanks, car batteries, oil based paints, etc. are considered hazardous and cannot be disposed of in the trash. The Camden County Department of Environmental Affairs sponsors household collection disposal drop off sites throughout the County during the year. For more information please contact the CCDEA at 858-5241. County special waste collection dates are also available on the Camden County website at [www.camdencounty.com/service/environmental-affairs/recycling](http://www.camdencounty.com/service/environmental-affairs/recycling).

**CAR BATTERIES:** Can be disposed of at most local auto part stores for a nominal fee or can be disposed of at Camden County Hazardous waste drop off sites. For dates and times please call the CCDEA at 856-858-5241. Do not put curbside for recycling or trash pickup, it will not be picked up.

**STREET SWEEPER:** The goal of DPW is to sweep the whole town two to three times a year. Once in early Spring, once in late Spring and/or early Summer and once in late Summer. We will advertise on the Borough website and post signs in your district the week prior. In order to provide a more efficient job, residents need to move their cars off the street on your scheduled week. Every effort will be made to stay on schedule but delays can happen due to manpower, breakdowns, weather, etc. First sweep will be as follows: District 1 week of May 27th, District 2 week of June 3rd and District 3 week of June 10th.

**TEXTILE DONATIONS:** The Borough has (2) textile donation containers, (1) located at the Borough Hall parking lot and (1) located at the entrance gate to the DPW. Residents may drop off clothes, shoes, blankets, draperies, sheets,

and any other type of textiles. Please do not drop off any items that are contaminated, meaning items that are wet, soiled, etc. Items other than those mentioned are not acceptable. Put your items in the container do not leave on the ground outside the container.

**DIG SAFELY:** Homeowners are reminded that prior to any type of excavation work you are required to call the New Jersey One Call Center at 1-800-272-1000 or 811 to request a mark out of all underground utilities. This is the law in New Jersey and is for your safety. Examples of excavation could be but are not limited to landscaping, irrigation systems, fencing installations, concrete work, etc. If you have a Contractor doing your work the Contractor should be aware of this requirement also. If you see colored paint markings in the road or colored flags on your property, these are utility markings. Yellow = Gas, Red = Electric, Orange = Communication/CATV, Blue = Water, Green = Sanitary Sewer, White = Proposed excavation area.

**HOLIDAY SCHEDULE THRU AUGUST**

**MEMORIAL DAY:** May 27th (Monday) - DPW closed. All services rescheduled for the following day.

**INDEPENDENCE DAY:** July 4th (Thursday) - DPW closed.

**STORMWATER PROGRAM REGULATIONS**

**CONTAINERIZED YARD WASTE:** Per ordinance #813 - Prohibited conduct - The Owner or Occupant of any property, or any Employee or Contractor of such owner or Occupant engaged to provide lawn care or landscaping services, shall not sweep, rake, blow or otherwise place yard waste, unless the yard waste is containerized, in the street. If yard waste that is not containerized is placed in the street, the party responsible for placement of yard waste must remove the yard waste from the street or said party shall be deemed in violation of this ordinance.

**StormWater Management:** Chapter 104 Borough Code Article X Reduction of Extraneous Flow, Sump Pumps and Storm Drain Collector's States:

No person shall connect any Sump Pump or Storm Drainage Collectors to a Sanitary

Sewer line. This includes, but is not limited to roof drains, leaders, gutters, stormwater detention ponds or tanks. The record title owner shall be responsible under this subsection and shall be presumed to have caused any such connections.

All dwellings, buildings or structures have surface or groundwater drains, including sump pumps, and storm drainage, including roof drain, now connected and/or discharging into the sanitary sewer system shall disconnect and/or remove the same by January 1, 2008. Any disconnects or openings in the sanitary sewer shall be closed or repaired in effective, workmanlike manner, as approved by the Borough Superintendent of Public Works and/or Borough Engineer.

**SEWER UTILITY:**

Chapter 35 Borough Code Article I States:

The Sewer Utility shall only be responsible for the maintenance and operation of the Sewer Mains, Manholes, and Pump Station within the right of ways and easements owned by Barrington Borough. It shall be the responsibility of the property owner to maintain and repair the lateral sewer from any buildings of the property to the sewer main connection. The Sewer Utility shall NOT be responsible for any damage from overflow of any plumbing fixture, open or broken sewer pipe that is located below grade level within the property.

A Permit to do repairs or replacements to any lateral located within the right of way or easements of the Barrington Sewer Utility shall be required. A fee of \$30.00 shall be charged for this permit. All work must be inspected by the Borough Sewer Inspector before it is covered with dirt. (Note: any work performed within the Borough owned street will require a street opening permit).

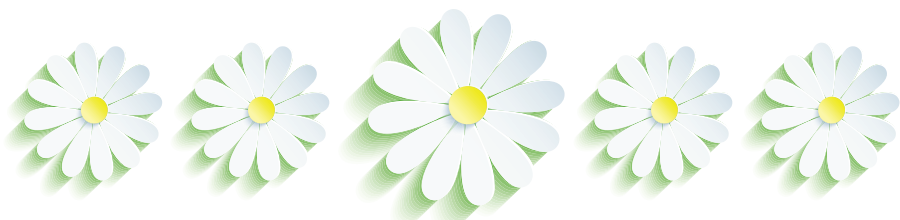

## War Monuments



Did you know that the war monuments were not always on Haines Avenue behind the Municipal Building? Come out to the next meeting of the Barrington Historical Society when Sandy Bowen, our Recording Secretary, will tell

Now to continue with street names, Davis Rd. probably is our oldest street, going back to the 1770’s. A Davis family lived there. DuBois Ave. was named for former Mayor Earl DuBois. This family of lawyers was the legal counsel for the developer of the Gardens section, Thomas Edwards. Erie Ave. was named by the first real estate developer in town, the Barrington Syndicate in 1890. Edwards Ave. was named for the builder Thomas Edwards. Enders Ave. received its moniker from Walter Enders who was a Councilman in the 1950’s. Flower Lane led to the Baptiste and Poiron flower farms. Burr Haines bought land around 1870 and built houses on streets near the railroad. His house was where the post office is now, built in 1850 and a stop on the Underground Railroad. Hobart Dr., Kent Ave. and Princeton Rd. were named by the Haddonstock Corp. in 1925 which went bankrupt after building a few houses. Hutchinson Road was named for the family whose farm was here. Hearne Dr. was named for Marine Paul Hearne who was killed in the World War II invasion of Guam. Kingston and Reading Aves. were both named by the Barrington Syndicate in 1890. Scheina Ave. was named for William Scheina, who was also a Councilman during the 1950’s. His brother, George, was a tail gunner on a B-24 bomber and killed in Europe. More streets name will be in the next issue of On Track.

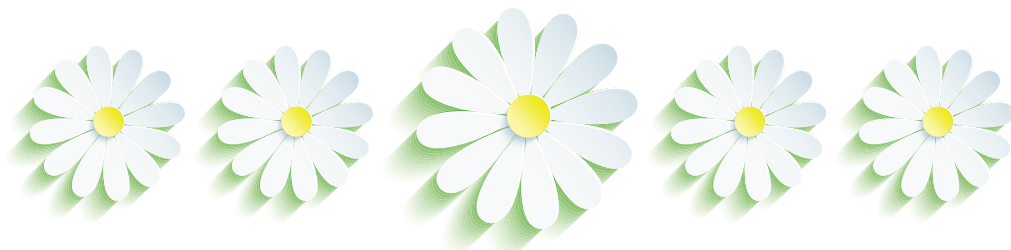

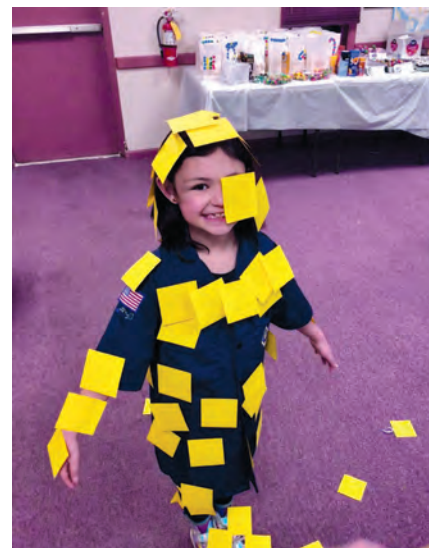
Our Lion Den earned their Mountain Lion requirement when they visited the Cohanzick Zoo and learned how to use the buddy system and what to do when they are separated from the group.
