BOROUGH OF BARRINGTON MINUTES OF THE 105th ANNUAL REORGANIZATION MEETING

The Reorganization Meeting of the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington was held with Mayor Patti Harris presiding.

REMARKS BY NEWLY ELECTED OFFICIALS:

COUNCILMAN ROBENOLT— congratulated Mike Beach. Thanked his family, his wife is still at work and could not be here, thanks for putting up with all he does throughout the year. Thanks to

the residents for their support, thanks to the professionals and staff, and all the department heads. Chief Baus, special thanks for all your service to Barrington. It has been a trying time and your professionalism is appreciated. He has done an outstanding job for this town.

COUNCILMAN BEACH – congratulated Wayne on a great job this year. Thanks to my family for putting up with me when I take random two-hour drives around town to check things out. Thanks to the state legislators and county commissioners for their help--they are always there for Barrington, all our employees and departments from the supervisors on down. All care about this town. And thanks to the residents for putting their faith in me again--you make it easy to love this town and to do what we do and put in the time. ROLL CALL OF COUNCIL: The Municipal Clerk called roll of council with the following in attendance: Councilman Beach, Councilman Cerrito, Councilman Drumm, Councilman Hanson, and Councilman Robenolt. Councilman Ludwig had not yet arrived.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS:

BARRINGTON'S BEST: presented by Councilman Hanson to the Dinella Family, who unfortunately was unable to attend. Mike, who is a former councilman, and his wife Michele, raised their two kids, Max and Mya, in town. They are silent supporters of many local charities and organizations in town. Over the last two years the Dinella Family has made numerous donations to our food pantry, and they reach out often to see if we are in need of any supplies. We thank them for their continued support of our town and the borough food pantry. We are proud to present them with this year's Barrington's Best Award.

VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR AWARD: presented by Councilman Hanson to Grace Bible Church. The Church and its community give back in so many ways, outside of their religious offerings, they operate a local food pantry that helps dozens of local families each month, they host free family events throughout the year, such as this years Easter Egg Hunt, annual Back to School Bash and recently some Phillies World Series watch parties. They participate in and help to run the Barrington Harvest Festival and Barrington Day. They also host local blood drives, meet up events for mom's who have children with special needs and sewing nights where they donate items for Options for Women in Cherry Hill. In 2020 they paid off the school lunch debts for students in Avon and Woodland schools which totaled over \$1,400. Our town would not be the same without Grace Bible and it's love and dedication to our community. Thank you!

POLICE AND FIRE AWARDS: Chief Minardi recognized Sgt. Gary Hawkins, Patrolman Kiernan McKeown, Cherry Hill Firefighter Jeffrey Marsden and retired Atlantic City Airport Firefighter John Karolinski. On November 4, Marsden and Karolinski were driving through Barrington on Shreve Avenue and saw smoke coming from a residence. They pulled over, exited their vehicle and checked to see if anyone was inside while calling 9-1-1. They were able to go inside and heard a faint cry for help. Sgt. Hawkins and Ptl. MeKeown arrived on scene to assist. The house was full of smoke but the four men worked together and were able to rescue the victim. Because of their actions, displaying bravery without regard for their own safety, they were able to safe the life of this victim. They are being presented with the Live Saving award.

POLICE OFFICER OF THE YEAR FOR 2022: presented by Chief Minardi and Councilman Hanson to Officer Tyrell Thomas. Officer Thomas is a great representative of the Barrington Police Department and is very deserving of Officer of the Year. He is the total package as a police officer. He is one of the most proactive officers on the street and takes the initiative to build bonds with the community. Along with Lt. Kinkler of the Haddon Heights Police Department, Officer Thomas created the Garnet County Outreach Program, which involves officers going to the high school on their own time and talking with students. Officer Thomas has turned this program in to something great. He is always trying to learn and make himself a better police officer. With his

great attitude and hard work, he has established himself as a leader in the police department. The Chief is very proud of the job Officer Thomas has done and can't wait to see what he does in the coming years. Officer Thomas received a standing ovation.

Mayor Harris expressed thanks to all of the award winners.
