#### Administration

- •Amendment to contract with Runnemede for EMS services—Runnemede's need for EMS services has increased as they lost one of their daytime EMT's. Kate has been talks with them about expanding the service Barrington provides. Kate will be present to explain the increase in services she will be providing. This will be an addendum to the original contract and will require a resolution.
- •Stormwater Assistance Grant—we had applied for a Stormwater Assistance Grant for the work to be done in drafting the new stormwater plan and associated ordinances. The grant is for \$25,000 and will require a Chapter 159 resolution (after budget adoption).
- •Resolution for Local Governing Body support of the 2023 PSE&G Energy Efficiency Partnership Program—Brittany Beyer, Chairperson of the Green Team, submitted an application to the PSE&G Energy Efficiency Program and it was approved by PSE&G. This is an addendum to the program we recently did with PSE&G where they came in and audited all of our facilities for energy efficiency upgrades. This program expands to cover residential audits as well. We will be launching a campaign later this summer to encourage residents to have the energy audit done. The audits are free and then PSE&G recommends upgrades the resident can make to increase efficiency and PSE&G pays for a large percentage of the improvement. The partnership program requires a resolution of support which will be on next week's agenda.
- •Community Garden —there was a delay in scheduling the ground-breaking for the Community Garden. It has now been scheduled for Saturday, May 13. So far, five plots have been purchased. We expect a lot more after Barrington on Track goes out.
- •Barrington on Track—was finalized yesterday. Is scheduled to be printed and mailed this week.
- Budget adoption—the public hearing and adoption of the budget will be on next week's agenda.

•Elected Official Risk Management Seminar—the deadline to complete this training has been extended to May 31. So far, only two of you have completed this training. The flyer with the simple instructions is attached. We get a premium credit of \$250 per person for each of you who completes this training. Please take 20 minutes to complete this training.

#### 2022-2023 ELECTED OFFICIALS RISK MANAGEMENT SEMINAR

This course details ways to control workers' compensation and liability insurance costs. Municipal elected officials, authority commissioners and a member's CEO (i.e., municipal manager / administrator or executive director) who completes this course by the extended deadline of May 31, 2023, may qualify for a \$250 credit (capped at approx. 5% of MEL assessment) in their local unit 2023 assessment.
