WHEREAS N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997, and

WHEREAS pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5 the Borough of Barrington has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the Borough of Barrington meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2025 budget year;

NOW, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Governing Body of the Borough of Barrington that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & b and based upon the Chief Financial Officers' certification the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq. are fully met (Complies with the "CAP" law.)
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
- 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate, and correctly stated.
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth.
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement, and content the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced, publicly advertised, and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

WHEREAS the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act (N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq) permits two local units to enter into a contract for any service which any party to the agreement is empowered to render within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS the parties acknowledge the need to amend Resolution 3-2025-39 and the 2025 Shared Services Agreement to provide for the services of Kristy Emmett as Merchantville's Tax Collector for five (5) months, on a part time basis, for the sum of \$12,904.00; and

WHEREAS the Governing Body has determined that it is in the best interests of the Borough to amend the Shared Services agreements with the Borough of Merchantville to provide such services;
